

Lynn Says

I have no idea how my newspaper career came about because we were in the radio business when we moved to Alva.

I was thinking about my childhood the other day and some unique jobs I had and privileges that came my way. Everything I did pointed to a career in electronics and engineering.



Of course, as a kid, I made money mowing other people's yards. We had an old Reo green and cream colored push lawn mower. I had perhaps half-dozen yards I would regularly mow. Probably at \$1 each. About the same time, I had a paper route.

My favorite job as a kid, and I probably started at age 12, was to change the tower light bulbs in the radio tower of my Dad's radio station, KTTR. The tower was about 180 feet tall and had three levels of light bulbs. I was paid \$10 for the first level, \$20 for the second level

and \$30 for the top level. I had to wear a safety belt that wrapped around the entire triangular tower. I'm surprised my mother permitted this.

The safety belt was quite a mess. It was a good strong leather one, but one time my Dad decided he could save a lot of money in having the tower painted. He hired me to paint the tower with alternating "aviation orange" and white sections. You fastened the two cans of color paint on your belt and used cotton gloves on your hand to dip into the paint bucket and apply the paint by rubbing your gloved hand up and down the tubing. Of course, if you reached too high, the paint would run down your arm into the arm pit. After that job, the leather safety belt was forever splattered with orange and white paint. I can't recall, but I think I did a really crummy job.

In our town, the city owned the power utility company. My dad befriended the white-haired manager of the place. As usual, I was tagging along with Dad and the manager asked if I would like some old power meters. "Sure," was the answer. These were those rather large wall-mount meters with the big kettle-shaped glass that contained the gears that counted revolutions of a small disc. I believe the readouts were three little white clock-like devices.

Anyway, those meters were a blast to take a part. They contained huge magnets about eight inches long that were so powerful they could pick up almost any metal around. I remember having a lot of fun turning the little gears that changed the readouts.

I was very interested in amateur radio in those days because of my dad's business partner, Martin Mitchum, who was an old retired Navy radio guy. He had a very elaborate ham radio station.

I couldn't afford to buy any gear, and back then nearly all the transmitters and antenna systems were handmade. On the flip side, everybody bought commercial Hallicrafters and Hammarlund receivers. I did learn Morse code and passed the five-word-per-minute novice test. Later, when I earned my pilot's license, that previous knowledge of Morse code was very useful.

I suppose the most interesting thing to come out of my interest in ham radio was using the ARRL handbook to build a huge antenna array out of telephone company P-cable, that measured about 200 feet per side in a rhomboid shape. My goal was to pick up television signals of Cardinals baseball games from Channel 2 in St. Louis, 120 miles away. There was a vacant lot across from our two-story house that had big trees at one end. I strung the cable across the street and attached it to several trees in an approximate rhomboid shape. It never worked in picking up Channel 2. I later learned that such an antenna needed to be about 1.5 wave-lengths above the ground. Mine was probably too low by about 250 feet.

One other boyhood experience was trying to build a reflex horn loud hi-fi speaker. This came from a do-it-yourself plan in Popular Electronics. You cut soft Celotex panels (probably made of asbestos) and fashioned the "folded reflex design." I put a 12-inch speaker in it and was thrilled that Johnny Cash's "I Walk the Line" sounded darn good. I played it at top volume, no doubt driving my ever-patient mother crazy.

My dad was also friends with the manager of the local telephone company. They were just phasing out the old wall-mount hand-crank phones and were replacing them with rotary dial desk phones. I was given quite a few of those hand-crank wooden case telephone sets and had fun building my own tiny phone system. I strung a cable to the bedroom of a boy next door, and we both had one of the old phones. They worked fine with a couple of large lantern batteries to power the system.

Gina Jeanette Atha was born January 19, 1958, in Alva, Oklahoma, to J.W. Small and Ruth Ann (Vore) Small and passed away early Sunday morning, September 3, 2017, in her Clinton home.

Jeanette, as her family and friends called her, was raised in Dacoma, Oklahoma, where she started school. Later Dacoma and Carmen consolidated and she graduated from Carmen-Dacoma High School in 1976. She continued her education at Northern Oklahoma College in Tonkawa, and transferred to Southwestern Oklahoma State University in Weatherford where she graduated with a Recreational Leadership degree. She married Fred Atha on August 16, 1980, in Dacoma, Oklahoma. They moved to Pond Creek where she was employed at the Oklahoma State Department of Health and then transferred to Western Oklahoma where she worked for the Health Department until 1991. She received a position with the Oklahoma

Department of Education and retired there in 2014.

She is a member of the First United Methodist Church where she was very active in the church choir; she is also a member of P.E.O. and a past member of the Ambucs Club.

She was preceded in death by her parents.

She is survived by her husband, Fred, of the home; daughter, Jenisa Atha, Oklahoma City; son, Jared Atha and his wife Alison, Canute; two sisters, Jennie Small, Woodward, and Lisa Boler and her husband, Mark, Enid; brother, Preston Small, Dacoma; two grandchildren, Katherine Atha and James Atha, both of Canute; numerous other aunts, uncles, nieces and nephews and other family members.

L.E. CASTLE

L.E. Castle of Jet, Oklahoma, was born January 18, 1926, and passed away on September 3, 2017, at 91 years of age. A bigger than life personality, L.E. made a huge difference



in the lives of many people through his career as a vocational agriculture teacher, his participation in numerous civic organizations and boards, his church service, his work in the field of agriculture, and his devotion to his family.

L.E. graduated from Jet High School with the class of 1943, and went to Oklahoma State University where he graduated with a degree in animal science.

While at OSU, he was a member of Farmhouse Fraternity and was on the undefeated National Champion Meat Judging Team. He also participated in football and wrestling.

He began his career in 1950 as a vocational agriculture teacher in Billings. In 1952, he moved to Burlington where he taught for 18 years and was an active community leader. His 1966 Burlington FFA Judging team was the top livestock judging team in Kansas City, Denver, Oklahoma City and Tulsa, and was the

National Champion Livestock Judging Team. L.E. was Alfalfa County Teacher of the Year and was president of the Oklahoma State Agriculture Teachers Association.

After leaving his career as a vocational agriculture teacher, L.E. and Joan moved to the family farm in Jet and were actively engaged in farming with his brother Richard, nephew Kent, and great-nephew Colton. That part of his life was very special to him as he loved the land and farming and was never happier than when he was in the harvest field or checking cattle.

L.E. and Joan were named Farm Bureau Farm Family of the Year in 1986. L.E. was inducted into the Oklahoma Vocational Agriculture Teacher's Hall of Fame in 2000. In 2007, he was inducted into the Oklahoma Agriculture Hall of Fame by Governor Brad Henry.

L.E.'s participation in civic and community activities was an important aspect of his life. He assisted in organizing the Burlington Lion's Club and was a founding member of the Jet Lions Club. He was a member of the Jet-Nash School Board, and a longtime active member of the Jet-Nash Athletic Booster Club. He was president of the Jet Coop Board, the Jet Fair Board, and also helped with Jet Homecoming celebrations. L.E. was proud of his work as a Mason and earned the 32nd Degree.

He was a member of the Federal Land Bank Board of Directors and served as president of the National Federal Land Bank Association for two years. He served on the Alfalfa County Fair Board, Farm Bureau Resolution Committee, and OSU Agriculture Education Scholarship Committee. He was a member of the Oklahoma Wheat Growers, Oklahoma Swine Growers, and Cattleman's Association. He also received the FarmHouse Master Builders Award.

His church was a very important part of his life, and he was a long-time member of the Jet United Methodist Church. He taught Sunday school, was president of the administrative board, finance committee chairman, pastor parish relations committee chairperson, and sang in the choir.

But of most importance in L.E.





Numerous arrests by drug task force

Numerous misdemeanor drug charges were filed in Alfalfa County District Court Aug. 30 and 31.

Cy R. Buckley, 49, of Enid was charged with possession of controlled dangerous substance – marijuana and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia. He was arrested on Aug. 26 at Great Salt Plains State Park when officers stopped to assist a couple in a parking lot having car trouble. They discovered Buckley had a warrant from the Crescent Police Department. They saw something in the front seat that looked like paraphernalia and received permission from the female driver to search the vehicle. Items located included a glass pipe with burnt residue, a small burnt marijuana joint, and rolling papers.

Rickie Lee Crigger, 57, of Cherokee has been charged with possession of controlled dangerous substance (marijuana) and driving without a driver's license. He was arrested a half mile north of the Highway 11 and Highway 64 junction in Alfalfa County on Aug. 29. Crigger's vehicle was stopped due to excessive tinting of the windows. The officer smelled an odor of marijuana and asked Crigger about it. He said, "You're going to find it anyway." He pulled a baggie from a sunglasses compartment in his vehicle. Crigger admitted he has not had a valid driver's license for 10 years, saying first it was suspended and then it expired.

Amos Walter Rogers, 47, of Buffalo, Missouri, has been charged with possession of controlled dangerous substance (marijuana) and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia. Adrienne Marie Hockett, 27, of Enid has been charged with public intoxication. The Mooreland police chief was working with a drug task force interdiction in

Alfalfa County and stopped Rogers' vehicle for going 86 mph in a 65 mph zone on Highway 11. Rogers admitted to having "a little weed" in the vehicle. Hockett, a passenger, said the weed was not hers and her drug of choice was meth. She did however say she had smoked some of the marijuana. A search of the vehicle netted numerous items some of which tested positive for marijuana. According to court records, the pair said they were on the way to Colorado with \$800 to buy marijuana.

Juan Angel C. Montalvo, 70, of Cherokee has been charged with possession of controlled dangerous substance (methamphetamine) and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia. Rhonda Marie Bennett, 45, of Cherokee has been charged with possession of controlled dangerous substance (methamphetamine) and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia. The two were arrested on Aug. 30 after the drug task force stopped a flatbed pickup pulling a trailer with some riding lawnmowers and equipment on Highway 64. Officers said the vehicle crossed over the center line and the trailer had no turn signal or brake lights. According to court documents, when the passenger, Bennett, was asked to exit the vehicle, she asked Montalvo to take care of her sunglasses, tossing the case to his side. He put the case on the dashboard, and an officer saw the silhouette of a straight object inside. When he asked about it, Montalvo handed him the case saying, "None of this is mine; it's all hers." Inside the officer found two hypodermic needles containing a clear substance that field tested positive for methamphetamine. Bennett said the needles belonged to Montalvo.

Patrick Allen Smith, 39, of Enid has been charged with possession of controlled dangerous substance (methamphetamine)

and possession of controlled dangerous substance (marijuana). He was arrested Aug. 30 following a traffic stop on Highway 11 for doing 77 mph in a 65 mph zone. The drug task force ran a K-9 dog around the vehicle after asking the occupants to step outside. Smith was a passenger in the vehicle, and an officer patted him down for weapons. During the search, the officer could see into a pocket of his cargo shorts and saw a wooden box called a dugout and commonly used for keeping marijuana and a pipe. He asked about it and Smith acknowledged it contained marijuana. When arrested, he was asked about anything else on his person, and he told the officer that had some dope (methamphetamine) in his underwear.

Chaz Allen Smith, 28, of Cherokee was charged with possession of controlled dangerous substance (marijuana) and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia. According to court records, he was arrested on Aug. 30 by members of the drug interdiction team. Officers saw the vehicle, which was missing a rear bumper, stopped at the Highway 8 and Highway 64 junction. The car was following a semi very closely so officers conducted a traffic stop. While the driver was out of the car, officers told the passenger they were going to conduct a free air sniff of the vehicle with a K-9. The passenger handed over a wooden dugout containing two pipes and a small amount of a green leafy substance that field tested positive for marijuana. The passenger said the dugout had been hidden in the passenger door and belonged to Smith. Officers talked to Smith who said the dugout and contents belonged to him. He was arrested, and his vehicle was released to his wife.

George Albert Cheney, 47, of Medford has been charged with possession of controlled dangerous substance (marijuana) and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia. According to court documents, on Aug. 30 Deputy T.J. Rockenbach stopped a car with a faulty headlight while patrolling on SH-11. He explained to Cheney that his passenger side headlight was flickering. He checked Cheney's license and wrote him a warning for the headlight. Rockenbach conducted a free air sniff of the vehicle

Alva husband and wife win Kiowa's Labor Day 5K Race

Race entrants 384, finishers total 312

It was a comfortable 68 degrees during Kiowa's 33rd Annual Labor Day 5K Race that started near 8:30 a.m. Monday. However, listening to runners huff and puff as they ran by mid-way through the race, it was apparent the high humidity was a

factor.

With a time of 16:24 (16 minutes, 24 seconds) Luis Chavez of Alva won the race in Kiowa for the second consecutive year. He beat his winning time in last year's 5K race, which was 16:49. He completed the race two minutes faster than the competitors in his age division (20-29). His fastest time for a 5K is 16:05, he said. Chavez plans to run in the 5K in Alva this coming weekend in conjunction with the car show.

Originally from Beaver, Chavez graduated from Northwestern Oklahoma State University (NWOSU) at Alva last December (2016). He's now working on his master's degree in adult administration with sports administration. After running as one of the top cross-country contenders as a student at NWOSU, he is now an assistant coach to head cross-country coach Jill Lancaster at the university. Chavez works as an assistant manager at Alva's Market.

Now 24, Chavez said he started running over 10 years ago. He trains on his own, averaging 90 miles per week, running lots of country roads in the Alva area to compete in both half and full marathons. His fastest marathon time to date is 2 hours, 39 min and 59 seconds. He's qualified for the Boston Marathon next April.

"I love running. It's my passion," Chavez said. When he can, he likes to go to Oklahoma City and run there with friends.

He married Bailey June 23. She began running a year ago in the spring. Bailey ran Kiowa's 5K this year and came out the winner in the women's division with a time of 22:25. She is in training to run the half marathon in Dallas in December while her husband runs the full marathon. Bailey is an education major at NWOSU and also an assistant manager at Alva's Market.

Kiowa 5K Race founder Kent McBrayer said that 384 entered the race this year. Of those, 312 finished the race. That includes runners and walkers. Those numbers are down from last year, but McBrayer said, "Anytime we have at least 300 we are happy."

McBrayer said two of Kiowa's 5K records were broken in this race. Breaking the Female Age 9 and Under record of 26:05 was Micah McGee with a time of 25:29. The other broken record was in the Male 70 and Over category. McBrayer said both the first and second place winners "shattered" the existing record of 29:23. Those men are: first, Robert Strandberg, 25:14; second, Doug Brown, 26:56.




Desiree Doherty is improving from injuries sustained in UTV accident

Love fund established at First State Bank in Kiowa

Since she was seriously injured in a UTV accident Aug. 22, Kiowa, Kansas, teen Desiree Doherty has been in St.

Francis Hospital in Wichita.

She is the 15 year-old daughter of John and Mariah Doherty of Kiowa who have been at her side since the accident.

A call to Mrs. Doherty Tuesday found that the lumbar drain was taken out that afternoon. This drainage problem had again kept Doherty in ICU. Her mother said once doctors determine that everything is working, she'll hopefully get to return to a regular room. The hope is that the high school sophomore will get to come home later in the week, "if all goes well," her mother said.

Mrs. Doherty said her daughter is making progress and her pain is "a lot better than it was." However, she still has pain and is on pain meds that make her sleepy, her mother said, and added that she has no idea when she'll be able to return to school. Desiree has undergone at least two surgeries stemming from her head trauma.

"It's been quite the roller coaster," Mrs. Doherty said. "It finally feels like we're on the mend. We're very thankful."

Because of the expenses the Dohertys have incurred (and mom and dad have not worked since the accident), friends have established a love fund in Desiree's name. It's the Desiree Doherty Love Fund at the First State Bank in Kiowa. Tuesday's election: all the information you need

Voters will go to the polls Tuesday for the Sept. 12 City of Waynoka and Freedom School Special Elections, Woods County Election Board Secretary Sandra Koehn said today.

Please keep the following information and tips in mind as the election approaches.

- Early voting will be available at the County Election Board office located at 410 4th St., Alva, OK, Suite C on Thursday, Sept. 7, and Friday, Sept. 8, from 8 a.m. until 2 p.m.

- Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 12. Lines are possible at peak voting times. Wait times will likely be shortest at mid-morning and mid-afternoon. Anyone in line to vote at 7 p.m. will be allowed to cast a ballot.

- Anyone who needs to look up their polling place, verify their registration information, or view a sample ballot can do so online. The Online Voter Tool can be accessed on the Oklahoma State Election Board's website: www.elections.ok.gov. Those who vote by mail can also check the status of their ballot using the Online Voter

Tool. Sample ballots are also available at the county election board office.

- Oklahoma law requires every voter who votes in person at the precinct polling place or during early voting at the county election board to show proof of identity before receiving a ballot. There are three ways for voters to prove their identity under the law (only one proof of identity is required): Show a valid photo ID issued by federal, state or tribal government, or show the free voter identification card issued to every voter by the county election board, or sign an affidavit and vote a provisional ballot. (If the information on the affidavit matches official voter registration records, the ballot will be counted after election day.)

- Physically disabled voters who cannot enter the polling place, need help marking their ballots, blind or visually disabled voters and illiterate voters may be assisted by a person the voter chooses. In all cases, a person providing such assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of the employer or an officer or agent

of the voter's union. A person providing assistance also must swear or affirm that the voter's ballots will be marked in accordance with the voter's wishes. Alternatively, all blind, visually impaired, and physically disabled voters in Woods County may use the audio-tactile interface (ATI), a feature offered on all Oklahoma voting devices, to vote privately and independently, either at Woods County Election Board during early voting or at their assigned polling place on election day.

- Voters who have moved since the last election, but who have not transferred their voter registration to their new address, may do so on election day by going to vote at the polling place where their registration has been in the past. While voting, they may fill out a form instructing the county election board to transfer their registration to the new address before the next election.

- Those who became physically incapacitated after 5 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 5, still can request an emergency absentee ballot. Those who might qualify for an emergency absentee ballot should contact the county election board office at 580-327-1452 as soon as possible for more information.

- Any violation of election law will be reported to the proper law enforcement authorities. Electioneering is not allowed within 300 feet of a ballot box. It is also unlawful to remove a ballot from the polling location, possess intoxicating liquors within half a mile of a polling place or to disclose how you voted while within the election enclosure.





Oklahoma police: Man arrested in hit-and-runs in Tulsa

TULSA, Okla. (AP) — Police arrested a 40-year-old man on a murder complaint in connection with two hit-and-run crashes that investigators believe targeted homeless people in Tulsa.

Jeremy Thacker was arrested Tuesday on complaints of first-degree murder and assault with a deadly weapon, Tulsa police spokeswoman Jeanne (GEE'-nee) MacKenzie said. MacKenzie said Thacker didn't speak to detectives, but that damage on his truck was consistent to both crashes.

It was not immediately clear if Thacker had an attorney.

Police first recovered a white pickup truck near a rock quarry in north Tulsa that detectives linked to the attacks. Thacker was arrested nearby a short time later.

The first crash occurred Monday morning under an interstate overpass and appeared to be a deliberate attack, Tulsa Police Sgt. Stephen Florea told the Tulsa World.

"The pickup truck actually circled the block a couple of times before coming back, driving up over the

curb and driving down the sidewalk to run over these individuals," Florea said. "There's just no way this could have been an accident."

He said the vehicular assault killed 46-year-old Shawn Birdo and hospitalized 49-year-old Cynthia Wallace, who suffered severe injuries. Both victims were sleeping at the time. Another man suffered a minor leg injury.

Hours later, another homeless woman was hospitalized after her legs were run over in a separate crash. Florea said evidence suggests that the driver swerved to hit the woman, who was sitting on a curb. Witnesses described the driver as a white man in his 40s.

The man who suffered a minor injury in the first crash, James Russell, said many homeless people sleep on the streets because they have nowhere else to go.

"I was very lucky today, and I'm very sorry that the people who were hit were hurt so bad and one lost his life," Russell said. "What the man did was terribly wrong, and I hope he's caught."


