# Can I actually declutter?

Without question, I would say my worst characteristic is the creation of clutter. I have four or five work desks at various locations and, in general, the top surface of each desk cannot be seen.



I have been reading some posts by Rodney Murrow who is planning to move to Norman.

He has been telling the ordeal of reducing his stuff in order to make the move. Many of his things are nostalgic involving relatives and old friends.

I think my clutter is both financially and practically based: "I paid good money for that and I can't throw it out because of that." Or "You will never know when you will need this."

I read an article this week about a firm in Canada (a couple of ladies, actually) who, for a fee, will come in and declutter your house. Part of the story had to do with a lady who knew she was nearing the end of her life and finally one day one of her sons gently explained, "Mom, you have many collections of items that are very important to you that none of us kids will be interested in. You need to figure out what to do with those items and not dump it on the kids."

My clutter-collecting habits were inspired by my paternal grandmother.

She lived through the Great Depression and endured serious poverty. I remember how she had a button jar and would clip off and save the buttons from any piece of clothing that was to be discarded. Of course, she made us clothing from bright-printed flour sacks.

My dad no doubt learned some of those habits from her and I watched him. He was an electronics collector. Also a book collector. It took a move from Missouri to Texas for him to declutter.

I have decluttered some over the years, but not nearly enough. We used to own two buildings in town, one by Arlo Collie's service station and one we rented near the Alva schools administrative offices. Both of those were crammed with items from my various careers. In the last decade, the buildings have been sold and I forced myself to give up 90 percent of the contents.

I couldn't go cold turkey. We purchased a couple of those railroad transport containers and placed them behind the newspaper office. One is almost empty and the other is loaded with audio, printing and newspaper gear.

I did bite the bullet the other day and threw away about six desktop computers. I used to keep those because I would need parts to repair other computers. One change in protecting working computers is to put a quality (about \$129 each) uninterruptible power surge protector on every computer we have. In the three years since I've done that, I've

not needed to replace a single computer power supply. As a result, my collection of old computers is really not needed. We still have frequent power drop-outs in Alva, but they no longer cause me a lot of computer work.

I've done much better at getting rid of paper clutter by purchasing a couple of Fuji document scanners. They scan about 50 pages a minute. When I pick up handouts at the various meetings I cover as a news reporter, they are easily captured by the scanner, and the hard copies tossed.

I saw a list of six ways to reduce clutter. I'll see what I can do. (This list came from MBG website.) Here they are:

1. Give yourself five solid minutes and see how much clutter you can clear. Most of us can hang on for five minutes.
2. Give away one item each day. Marione did this for me this month by giving to the Alva Public Library probably a hundred CD audiobooks.
3. Fill one box/bag and give it to Goodwill. The College Hill Church of Christ is beginning their clothing collection for their Warmth for Winter giveaway in late November. (Please don't give junk clothing. Make it quality stuff!)
4. Try a cloths hanger experiment. Turn all your hangars in a reverse direction. Turn them around when you wear something. In about three months you'll have a clear idea of what to toss.
5. Make a list of places in your home you need to declutter. Do one area, then stop. Do another item on your list the next day. Don't discourage yourself by tackling too much at a time.
6. Try the 12-12-12 challenge. Quickly locate 12 items to throw away, 12 items to donate and 12 items to return to their proper place.

## Alfalfa County commissioners discuss security updates

The Alfalfa County commissioners met briefly Monday morning to discuss security system updates to the Alfalfa County Courthouse, a legal matter and several routine items. Board members present at the meeting were Tobey Walker, Stan Tucker and Jay Hague.

The meeting began with Nancy Lambert giving the invocation and leading the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Thereafter, the board entered into executive session to discuss a legal matter with their attorney. When the board reconvened, the subject matter and contents of the discussion were not disclosed, although it did vote to appoint Walker as representative if it goes to trial.

Next, several routine items were approved, including the minutes from the previous meeting, several M & O warrants for payment, blanket purchase orders, and one road crossing permit for District 3 in the amount of \$2,250.

Further on the agenda, the board agreed to lease 0.21235 acres to Midstate Petroleum Company, LLC.

The final item discussed was for additional server storage to be added at the Alfalfa County Courthouse and a reconfiguration of its security system. Only one bid was received, from Digi Security Systems of Tulsa, who bid a total price of \$42,502.48.

The cost quoted will cover the new server, three new multi-head cameras for the jail (plus all wiring and cables), an enclosure to house the IT equipment, multiple microphones, the reconfiguration of the courthouse's existing 35 camera systems, technical assistance and, of course, installation of all of the above. The company also provides training for whoever will use the equipment. The company guarantees that the project will be completed within 60 days and the project comes with a three year warranty and the company's remote support if required.

The board voted to table this agenda item until it can be discussed with the sheriff at a later meeting.

# Alva School Board President Steve Ellis resigns

The Alva Board of Education called a special meeting at noon Monday for a two-item agenda. The first was to accept the resignation of board member Steve Ellis. Jane McDermott, vice-president, ran the meeting in Ellis's absence and said, "We accept this resignation with mixed emotions. Steve was a very dedicated and professional board member."



In his letter of resignation, he said he had served on the board for 12 years. The board will likely appoint someone to fill Seat 1 until the February school elections. Then that person, or other

candidates, will compete to fill the unexpired term.

The second portion of the meeting was to hear a presentation from Stephanie Hyder of the Oklahoma State School Boards Association about CSI (continuous strategic improvement.) The Alva board has the opportunity to sign a five-year contract and pay \$40,000 to Hyder and the K20 Center, for an educational and community improvement and planning process. The K20 Center is part of the OU Department of Education.

Hyder said the K20 group would provide approximately a half-dozen employees to work with about five segments of the Alva community to help develop goals and a five-year strategic

plan. The K20 Center advocates a five phase model to "transform conventional schools into high achieving, interactive learning communities: Leadership, Whole School, Teacher Learning, Student Engagement and University."

If the Alva Board of Education signs up, Hyder said it would take several months to get the process going. She listed a half-dozen schools who have agreed to the process, such as Duncan and other large schools.

The Alva board made no decision and expressed some concern that the teachers and administrators in the district are very busy trying to align courses and goals, under the coordination of Tim Argo, between the five building sites.

## House fire leads to search warrant, charges

A suspicious house fire in Cherokee Oct. 10 led to the arrest of two people. According to court records, Cherokee Assistant Police Chief Ryan O'Neil arrived at 821 S. Pennsylvania just before 8 p.m. to assist Cherokee Police Officer Brock Phillips at the fire. The residence at that location had extensive fire damage on the south side.

Phillips explained it appeared the fire might involve the manufacture of illegal narcotics. Cherokee Fire Chief Troy Eshelman also voiced the same suspicion.

McNeil accompanied Eshelman into the structure where they observed a bedroom on the south side had suffered the heaviest damage. McNeil observed a container of butane fuel and a small

propane-type bottle with a small nipple on it, items he recognized as commonly used in a butane hash oil (BHO) extraction lab. This is the process by which Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) is removed from marijuana using butane fuel to produce marijuana wax or dab.

Phillips said he observed a piece of pipe in the closet of the bedroom, also a necessary component of a BHO extraction lab. McNeil left the residence until a search warrant could be obtained.

Phillips told McNeil when he arrived at the residence, he spoke with Mary Bazer who said she had been asleep when the fire started, and she was awakened by Daniel Engle throwing their children onto her.

Phillips said he spoke with a

neighbor who said Bazer told her that she had been plugging in a space heater when the fire started and they ran out of the house.

Just after midnight, a search warrant was executed at the residence. Officers found numerous items of drug paraphernalia, some with residue. Inside a safe were items including a digital scale with residue, a small mirror with residue, and other paraphernalia. Several of the items field tested positive for methamphetamine.

Both Mary Alexandra Bazer, 29, of Cherokee and Daniel Paul Engle Jr., 29, of Cherokee have been charged with child neglect, a felony, for failing to protect their children ages 3 and 5 from exposure to the use and possession of illegal drugs. This crime is punishable in the custody of the Department of Corrections not exceeding life imprisonment, or by imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one year, or by a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than \$5,000, or both such fine and imprisonment.

In addition, Bazer and Engle are charged with misdemeanors of possession of controlled dangerous substance and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia. Bond on the charges against Bazer and Engle totals \$25,000 each.




Summer Girty for details. People attending October Fest can sample the meat along with potatoes and baked beans and bread for \$5.

Finger said one more resolution needed signed. The council approved having Mayor Farney sign Resolution No. 284, which pertains to standards of conduct by the city.

Jenny Egging with EBH and Associates of Pratt asked to be on the agenda to introduce herself to council. EBH is an engineering firm. Egging said EBH does water line work, curb and guttering, flooding issues like Kiowa's 12<sup>th</sup> Street project, etc.

"I'm here to see if we'd be a good match," Egging said to council.

Because the city's landfill for grass clippings, trees, etc., is still so full from the summer storms, the council decided to hold off on Bi-Annual Trash Days scheduled for November. Instead, the council approved the next Bi-Annual Trash Days for April 6 and 13.

Leone requested that he transfer 80 hours of his sick time to another employee, which the council approved.

Police Chief Steve Johnson submitted his monthly report to council. He mentioned that Officer Warren Howeter has once again started the DARE program at the elementary school. Chief Johnson said an emergency preparedness drill is scheduled for Nov. 6 at 9 a.m.

City Clerk Brewer said they want more security at the city office as they've had a few "incidents." The council suggested cameras. Other measures are now in place.

### **Administrator Disagrees with Police Chief's Letter**

At the September council meeting, Police Chief Johnson submitted a prepared letter to council members and to the press. When asked by this Newsgram reporter at the end of the meeting if he'd like it to run as a letter to the editor with publisher approval he said yes. The letter was addressed to "Any and All Concerned Parties." His letter acknowledged getting a sizable raise for himself and an officer when the department downsized to two officers rather than three several years ago and there would be a freeze of future raises for the KPD for quite some time. He also mentioned a mill levy increase would be needed to give employee raises in the 2018 budget, which he said was discussed at a previous council meeting.

At the October meeting, Administrator Leone had typed and read a near two page response, disagreeing with the KPD Chief. Leone questioned why Johnson felt the need to post his letter in the newspaper.

Leone stated that a mill levy increase for employee's wage increases is not true. He said budgets are always written with a percentage increase in wages for every employee except the police department.

In 2014, when the KPD went to two officers instead of three, Leone said Chief Johnson received a 40 percent pay increase. The administrator said that Johnson's claim that this move saved the city over \$30,000 per year is not true. To make his case, Leone provided a list of police department budgets from 2009 to 2017. Leone mentioned the purchase of equipment, sometimes in threes for a volunteer reserve officer, and more.

### **Administrator Reports on 12<sup>th</sup> Street and Variety of Issues**

The survey of 12<sup>th</sup> Street and part of 11<sup>th</sup> Street is complete, Leone said. This is the area that has had flooding issues since the railroad abandoned the tracks. He presented the council with a map and said the goal is for the city to clean up

part of it. The map had small shaded areas of land that Leone said is currently owned by no one, the survey revealed. Therefore, no one pay taxes on it or is responsible to help improve it.

Leone said that this unclaimed property on the east side of the street can be claimed by landowners adjacent to it. He said property owners across the street would be notified of the additional property, but would have to go through the process of claiming it themselves.

The administrator wants to squelch the "rumor" that this is "a land grab" by the city. "That's not true."

Leone has and will be attending municipal gatherings. By attending the NCCI conference he said the city gets a two to three percent discount on worker's comp coverage. Oct.19-21 he'll attend the KMEA Conference in Wichita.

Leone thanked teens from the Methodist church youth group for painting parking lines. He said Savannah Hughbanks submitted an intern application.

The city office now displays new city maps to replace the ones that have been up since 1972. Leone said the city office tested positive for mold. There's an issue with ceiling tiles and new leaks in the office.

In council items, Simpson said police need to enforce the "No J-Turn Signs" on Main Street. He sees that happen frequently. He reiterated this is illegal because Kiowa's Main Street is also a state highway.

Although the KDH hospital foundation's Jeans and Gems fundraising event already occurred at the community building, the council officially waived the \$50 rental fee for use of the building.

In 2016, South Barber's volleyball team was both league and sub-state champion.








