Fighting new healthcare fee

I was considering a different topic for this column when J. Herning brought in a letter to the editor and a related article. He addresses a new healthcare issue, one that can affect anyone who seeks medical care. Here's the letter:



Letter to the Editor:

In late 2013 I had open heart surgery and a triple bypass at an Enid hospital. Obviously I survived, but it was hard. The surgeon did a good job.

Recently I went to the hospital-owned heart clinic in Enid for a check-up. They charged \$152 for a 20-minute appointment during which a P.A. checked me over and a nurse took my blood pressure.

However, the hospital then charged Medicare an additional \$260 as a "facility use fee" for a total of \$412. I have since learned charging a facility use fee is becoming a new "gotcha" imposed by hospital-owned clinics.

After the Medicare write down, the hospital said I still owed \$174. I was not informed beforehand about the "facility use fee," so I called Medicare and my co-insurance, and they said the charge was OK with them and I would have to pay because I had not met my deductible for 2019.

I'm going to fight this. I don't think it's right. I think \$412 for a 20-minute check-up is unfair and excessive.

But I suggest if you go in for a checkup, you ask first about the charges and how much of it you will have to pay.

It might surprise you.

P.S. I also suggest you check to see if you have air transport insurance. The helicopter ride to the city runs about \$50,000 without insurance.

Beware of this sneaky "gotcha" fee By Charles B. Inlander

A friend of mine recently went to an urgent-care center with a bad sore throat. She had been there many times in the past, and the facility always accepted her insurance plan. After handing over a co-pay of \$15 for urgent care, she left with a prescription. To my friend's surprise, she received a bill two weeks later from a nearby hospital demanding a \$100 "facility fee" for using the urgent-care facility. It turns out that the hospital had recently purchased the urgent-care center and was adding this fee to all bills at the center. None of this was disclosed to my friend when she was at the center. To make matters worse, her insurer would not pay the extra fee. I'll tell you what happened later in the column.

Facility fees are one of the biggest rip-offs the hospital industry has ever come up with. Across the country, consumers who go to "off-site" urgent-care centers or medical practices (they are not located on a hospital's campus but are owned by the hospital entity) are being charged facility fees that in some cases are higher than the cost of care that was provided. Sadly, the fees themselves are perfectly legal despite complaints to federal and state regulators and legislators from consumers and even some doctors.

The hospital industry defends these "gotcha" charges by saying the patient is receiving better care because the facility has all the hospital's resources behind it. But in most cases, nothing from the patient's perspective changed at the urgent-care center or doctor's office after being bought by the hospital. Now, with off-campus, hospital-owned urgent-care centers and medical practices growing in huge numbers (nearly 50 percent of all doctors are now hospital employed), these facility fees are becoming much more common. But you can protect yourself from paying up. Here's my advice to help you avoid

these costly bills.

- Pick up the phone. Plan ahead and find out if any urgent-care facility in your area that you may want to use in the future is owned by a hospital. If it is, ask if it charges facility fees. If so, ask what that fee is. Also, call your insurance carrier and ask if your plan covers facility fees at noncampus, hospital-owned urgent-care centers and/or medical practices (this includes hospital-owned, off-campus clinics that might perform colonoscopies, mammograms and other diagnostic tests). Insider tip: Be aware that nonhospital-owned facilities or medical practices cannot add these charges. So if you want to be sure to avoid facility fees, use nonhospital-owned urgent-care centers and medical practices.

- Fight back. My friend disputed her charge directly with the hospital's billing office, saying that she was never notified of this policy. The hospital still wouldn't budge. But she fought on, taking it to her state's consumer-protection bureau. This agency intervened, and the hospital dropped the charge for her. If you believe that you were not notified about a facility fee, either verbally or in writing (it's often in the fine print of paperwork you receive), before getting treatment, dispute it. You should first challenge the charge directly with the hospital. If turned down, ask if your insurer will help you fight the charge. And if that fails, try your state's consumer-protection agency (get contact information at USA.gov/state-consumer). Insider tip: Also contact your congressional representatives. Both your state and federal representatives can often help in these situations. Hospitals do not want to get on their bad side. And the more that political leaders hear about this practice from their constituents, the more likely the hospitals are to limit or ban these fees.

DAVID LYNN COX

David Lynn Cox of Alva, Oklahoma, passed from this life March 29, 2019, at the age of 75 years and one month. David was born February 25, 1944, in Alva to Fred and Wilma Jean Wesner Cox, the second of their four children.



He married Freeda Bird in 1965; to this union three sons were born, Anthony, Jason, and Brandon. He was a proud father of three and grandfather of five.

In 1988 David married Beverly Rogers Weinhoffer Cox, with whom he resided at the time of his death. With this union David gained four children, and over the years, 13 grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.

David was a dedicated father who sacrificed daily for the welfare of his family. His 50 years as professional registered land surveyor took him to many parts of the world although he always returned to Alva. During his career, he surveyed for the Naval Oceanographic Office, Washington, D.C., surveying the bottom of the ocean floor from the north Atlantic to the western Pacific. Later he worked for NASA in Maryland. David was a skilled draftsman, working for various architectural, surveying and engineering firms ranging from Maryland, New Jersey, Tennessee, Colorado, Texas, New Mexico and Oklahoma. In 1982 he began his own business, D.L. Cox Land Surveying, which he pursued until his death. He served as district chairman of OSLS, Oklahoma Society of Land Surveyors.

An avid and award-winning landscape photographer, hobby winemaker, and voracious reader of science fiction, he found time to ride his classic 1968 Norton 750 Commando motorcycle. His trips cross country did occasionally find him stranded in remote locations.

David took pleasure in helping others in need and was fondly known as a generous, sacrificial man who shall be greatly missed by his many friends, clients and family.

David was preceded in death by his

mother and father and his beloved son, Brandon Garth Cox.

He is survived by his sons Anthony and Jason, and their children, Brendan Cox, Christopher Cox, Danielle Cox, Mikala Cox, and Zachary Cox. David's two brothers, James and Larry, and their families, and his sister, Barbara Feezell, and her family mourn his passing. His survivors include Beverly, of the home, and his extended family of children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

As was his wish, his body was cremated and a wake in his honor will be held on Friday, May 10, at 7 p.m. in the Fireside Room of the Cherokee Strip Museum in Alva. His remains will be interred with his son at the Alva Municipal Cemetery.

WALTER DEE HACKNEY

On April 3, 2019, Walter Dee Hackney passed away at Porter Hospital in Denver, Colorado. Walter and his wife Sue had only recently moved to Castle Rock, Colorado, in the Denver area to be closer to family.

Walter Dee was born August 13, 1937, in Coldwater, Kansas. Soon afterward, his family moved to Freedom, Oklahoma, where his father Charles Hackney, better known as "Check" and mother Leona (Fross) Hackney lived with their family for several years before settling in Alva, Oklahoma. Walter's older brother Earl (deceased) and his beloved older sister "Colleen," who passed away just this last June of 2018, lived a life full of love, hardships, friendships, challenges and successes on the Oklahoma plains. Walter attended a one-room schoolhouse before moving to Alva where he completed high school.

One of Walter Dee's greatest testaments to his strength and character was surviving childhood bulbar polio, which paralyzed him from his chest down. Walter was able to eventually breathe and walk independently and return to school and activities.

After high school Walter attended Northwestern Oklahoma State University in Alva for two years before transferring to Oklahoma State University in Stillwater, Oklahoma. He has taken great pride in being a member of the 1958 OSU National Championship Livestock Judging team and has continued to be actively involved in their alumni program in the years since.

Immediately after graduating from Oklahoma State with a B.S. degree in Animal Science, Walter accepted a position with the John Morrell Company in Ottumwa, Iowa, as a cattle buyer trainee, a role that would come to define his career and life. This was the beginning of what was to become an illustrious career in agri-business spanning over 58 years making significant contributions to the industry.

In Ottumwa he met his future wife and life partner of 58 and a half years, Sandra Sue Anderson or "Sue," the name she went by. Walt's corporate positions and career soon moved his family across Kansas, Missouri, Texas, Iowa and finally Nebraska where they lived for over 40 years. Walter's involvement in the livestock and grain industry was later enhanced by his work as a writer for DTN's "Talkin Livestock," and Iowa Public Television's program "Market to Market" as a livestock analyst, as well as conducting risk management seminars for agricultural lenders throughout the United States.

Walter is survived by his loving wife Sue, son Jeff (wife Wendy), and daughter Jill Kalior (husband Larry); six grandchildren, Amber Hashemi (Shawn), Brandon Hackney (Danelle), Cole Hackney (Sarah), Summer Ashton, Shaun Kalior and Logan Kalior; as well as three great-grandchildren, Kallie, Kolby and Ava, in addition to the many cousins, nephews, nieces, and lifelong friends.

Walter Dee will be remembered as a "larger than life" personality with a voice that captivated his listeners. His love of his profession, industry, family, friends, story-telling, driving the countryside, nature, animals and boating on the Lake of the Ozarks will stay with us always.



The House finished its committee deadline this week for all policy bills from the Senate, as did the Senate with House bills. Interestingly, we started out the session with a total of 2,631 bills and joint resolutions filed between the House and the Senate. At the point where bills



traveled to the opposite side of the Capitol the number of active measures had been whittled down to 819 in total between the Senate and House. Now, after bills have gone through committees in the opposite chamber the number of bills surviving is down to about 645. I am sure before session is over the number of bills sent to the governor will be below 500.

This time of year, people who are paying attention to the process will hear many motions to strike title or the enacting clause. Bill authors will do this as a sign to other lawmakers that they want to keep the bill moving through the legislative process but they are



Cleo Springs woman charged with child endangerment

A concerned citizen alerted law enforcement to a woman smelling of alcohol who was driving with small children in the car. Alfalfa County Deputy Loren Nusser responded to the call about 8 p.m. on Tuesday, April 8. According to court documents, the citizen reported talking to a woman in the Jiffy Trip parking lot and said she smelled heavily of alcohol. The citizen said there were two children including an infant in the backseat of the grey Jeep Cherokee which headed south on Highway 8.

Nusser caught up with the vehicle at the junction of Highways 8 and 45. He noticed the vehicle was weaving from the white fog line to the yellow center line. Just south of the Highway 8 and Aline Blacktop intersection, the vehicle crossed the yellow center line. Nusser turned on his emergency lights and attempted to initiate a traffic stop. The driver eventually pulled over into a private driveway.

Nusser made contact with the driver, identified as Jodi E. Reamer, and told her he pulled her over for driving left of center. Nusser reported smelling the strong odor

of an alcoholic beverage coming from the vehicle and that Reamer's eyes were red and watery. He asked for her license and proof of insurance. She told him her license was revoked and she did not have insurance in the vehicle. She also stated that she thought she had warrants out of Alfalfa County.

Nusser heard a small child crying in the back passenger seat of the vehicle and saw a young child asleep in the back driver's side seat. Nusser told Reamer he could smell alcohol and asked how much she had to drink. She told him she drank two shots of Jager approximately 30 minutes earlier in Cherokee with a friend, according to the affidavit.

At this point, Nusser states, Reamer asked if she could call someone to get the children because she knew she was going to jail. He allowed her to make the call and to comfort the child. When asked the age of the children, Reamer said they were seven weeks old and four years old.

While they waited, Nusser asked if there was anything in the vehicle that shouldn't be there. Reamer said there was an open bottle of vodka under the driver's

seat. She said she bought it after drinking with her friend, and had opened it and taken a drink before leaving Cherokee. Nusser retrieved the bottle.

After someone came to pick up the children, Nusser conducted the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests on Reamer. He then arrested her and took her to the Alfalfa County Jail where she was booked and jailed.

Jodi Reamer, 28, of Cleo Springs, has been charged with two felony counts of child endangerment by driving under the influence. This crime is punishable by imprisonment for up to four years and/or a fine of \$5,000.

Reamer is also charged with driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol and driving with license suspended; both are misdemeanors. She was also given tickets for failure to comply with compulsory insurance law and transporting an open container of alcohol.

Reamer's bond was set at \$10,000, which she has posted. Her next court date is May 6.

Kiowa City Council considers more cuts for building projects, buys mowers, hears public concerns

Kiowa Mayor Bill Watson called the April meeting of the city council to order on the 8th with all members present. Councilmember R.L. Simpson offered a prayer and the members of the public packed in the council chambers recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Council members attending were: Brent Shaffer, Simpson, Russ Molz, Brian Hill and Tom Wells. City Administrator Lou Leone sat at the council table as did the City Attorney Brandon Ritcha and City Clerk Trish Brewer.

Public Agenda `Floods`

Discussion

Kiowa man Buddy Liggenstoffer spoke on the public agenda regarding term limits for council members. The item was on the agenda explaining there is "currently an issue regarding the term limit ordinance. Current term limits are subject to a regular ordinance which conflicts with Charter Ordinance 16. Leone said

both ordinances were passed on Nov. 9, 2015. The administrator said either choice may have an impact on the 2019 election cycle.

Leone recommended the council repeal the current ordinance (No. 425) and approve Ordinance 19-456 to align the city code book with Charter Ordinance 16. It passed 5-0. He is going to perfect the "charter" ordinance and "hopes to have" something ready for the May meeting.

Local businesswoman Miranda Allen also spoke on the public agenda. She was obviously unhappy about flooding that occurred in the old hospital building she owns that was Project Pink and is now closed. Allen told the council she requested and had confirmation that the water was shut off to that building. But on March 10, 2018, they discovered that water was shooting from the sprinkler system and totally flooded the basement. "There's already mold growing in the basement," she said and added

all the electric and plumbing is in the basement of that building. She said before this incident, the building was perfectly usable.

Walz said she had requested that a claim be filed with the city insurance provider since the city failed to turn off the water. She received notification that the city claimed no liability. At the meeting she again asked, "Why is it not filed with the city insurance?" Watson said the city's advice from council is that the city is not liable, and moved on to another agenda item. As she was walking out of the meeting, Allen said, "I guess we'll have to sue the city."

Regarding properties that get a letter from the city that need cleaned up, Bill Duvall addressed the council. He asked that the 10-day notice letters not be mailed on a Friday because that makes it tough to get the necessary improvements accomplished in the limited time.

City of Kiowa Business Including City Hall Building Project

At previous council meetings the bids for the city hall renovation project came in much higher than expected. BG Consultants Architect Clint Hibbs again attended the meeting to discuss the 5400 square feet building project. He reminded the original bids were from Minjares & Sons Construction LLC in Alva for \$701,164.98; and the other bid was from The Law Company, Inc. of Wichita for \$789,000.

Hibbs said, "Both contractors have done a great job of reducing their bids." Both bids were still over \$500,000. Councilmen Molz and Hill both agreed, "That's still way too much money."

Hibbs had a video ready to show but had technical difficulties so went to the drawing on an easel and white board. He showed more "bare bones" ways to cut expenses. The idea is to use almost every existing wall and minimize the amount of new construction. He gave more cost-cutting ideas, but of course

New Apron Exhibit and “Vintage Aprons: Tie One On” presentation scheduled at Sod House Museum

A new exhibit of aprons will open in May at the Sod House Museum near Aline, featuring a century’s-worth of vintage aprons. Margaret Goss of Carmen will present a lecture entitled “Vintage Aprons: Tie One On” at the Sod House Museum on Saturday, May 4, at 10 a.m.

Aprons have been around since ancient times and used for practical, decorative and ritualistic purposes. Apron comes from the French word “naperon,” meaning a small tablecloth. Women wore them to protect their clothes because they owned only one or two dresses. They were worn by homemakers, working people, tradesmen and artisans. Aprons also indicated a man’s trade: barbers wore checkered aprons; stonemasons wore white aprons; cobblers wore black; butchers wore blue stripes; butlers wore green; and weavers, spinners, and gardeners commonly wore blue.

“Aprons portray the fabric of people’s lives,” said Goss. Her

lecture will cover the history of vintage aprons from the early 20th century to the present day. Today she has a collection of more than 60 aprons. “I started collecting them because I just could not allow any to be thrown away,” said Goss. She will begin by explaining the need for aprons in the early 20th century, how feed sacks were used as apron fabric during the Great Depression, the common depictions of women wearing aprons in the 1940s and ’50s, and how aprons fell out of favor as old-fashioned in the late 1960s. She also will address the 21st-century fad of vintage aprons.

Goss’s lecture will draw attention to the new exhibit by discussing the history of the aprons on display. She will present a style show of aprons during the program and talk about the different styles and fabrics used throughout the century.

The Sod House Museum, a division of the Oklahoma Historical Society, is open Tuesday–Saturday, 9

Alfalfa County officials met Monday morning for their weekly commissioner meeting.

Routine business was addressed first with commissioners accepting and signing off on their monthly maintenance and operation warrants for payment and blanket purchase orders. One road crossing permit (\$500 for District 3) was accepted as well.

They next approved a contract with VoiceProducts LLC and went on to discuss old accounts and what they could do to utilize the full potential of their new accounting system. One was from an R-5 Insurance/Work Comp account to a C-1A Treasurer Personal Services account in the amount of \$1,345.45 to correct an amount of the county’s portion of dependent coverage, and another, for \$25,000, was moved to an account called B-1A Sheriff’s Personal Services



Group seeks to reduce Oklahoma's high incarceration rate

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — A coalition of business and faith leaders pushing a package of bills aimed at lowering Oklahoma's highest-in-the-nation prison incarceration rate are running into a familiar obstacle — the state's elected district attorneys.

Led by former Republican House Speaker Kris Steele, the bipartisan group hosted a rally on Tuesday and called on the Legislature to pass the package of bills aimed at stopping Oklahoma's skyrocketing prison population growth.

The bills would reduce criminal penalties for several nonviolent crimes and retroactively apply a state question approved by voters in 2016 that made drug possession a misdemeanor. Other bills would overhaul the state's bail system and reduce the likelihood of imprisonment for technical probation or parole violations.

"This is a pivotal moment in Oklahoma history," said Steele, flanked by dozens of women from a program in Tulsa that helps them adjust to life outside of prison. "We have the right people in place. Now is the time to act."

Oklahoma's new Republican Gov. Kevin Stitt has said reducing the state's prison population is a top priority, but many of the proposals are facing fierce opposition from district attorneys and law enforcement.

"The District Attorneys Association doesn't have any problem with well thought out criminal justice reforms, but some of the proposed legislation would create havoc in the criminal justice system," said Brian Hermanson, the top prosecutor for Kay and Noble counties.

Hermanson said the plan to retroactively apply State Question 780 to currently incarcerated inmates would require each of those cases to be reevaluated and returned to counties to be litigated again.

"That can be much more responsibly dealt with through the pardon and parole process," Hermanson said.

Stitt spokeswoman Donelle Harder said the governor remains committed to losing the state's dubious distinction as the nation's leader in incarceration. She said among the governor's priorities are funding the district attorneys through

the state's general fund rather than having prosecutors rely on collecting fees and fines from defendants. Many ex-inmates find it impossible to get back on their feet after being released from prison because of crushing debt from court costs.

"The biggest feedback he got from Oklahomans was about the debt," Harder said. "That's what people feel at the end of the day."

Oklahoma's state prison facilities are at 112 percent of capacity, and staffing levels are so low at some facilities that some fear the U.S. Justice Department could demand the state make changes, said Bobby Cleveland, director of the Oklahoma Corrections Professionals. Cleveland pointed to what is happening in Alabama, where the GOP-controlled Legislature was forced to boost funding by \$40 million, mostly to increase pay and hire an additional 500 officers for state prisons, to stave off a lawsuit from the Department of Justice over prison violence.

"The same thing's going to happen here if they don't do something now," said Cleveland, who is seeking a pay raise for Department of Corrections workers.





Ballots tossed over signatures mostly from same Kansas homes

WICHITA, Kan. (AP) — As an election supervisor and poll worker for more than 20 years, Robert Bailey routinely mailed in his ballot early, confident that voting problems elsewhere that he read about would have a slight chance of happening in his suburban Kansas City county.

So when the 82-year-old Republican learned from an Associated Press reporter that the ballot he mailed in advance of the 2018 primary was not counted because his signature didn't match his voter record, Bailey said he was "really incensed."

"What makes me feel bad is that they didn't advise me," Bailey said.

Bailey's discarded ballot was among 898 ballots that were rejected for various reasons in Johnson County in the contentious August primary that resulted in then-Secretary of State Kris Kobach defeating then-Gov. Jeff Colyer for the Republican gubernatorial nomination by only 343 votes statewide.

An AP analysis of the rejected votes in Johnson County — the state's most populous county — found that 153 primary mail-in ballots were not counted because of signatures that didn't match

the county voting records. Of those, 125 would-be voters had a family member living at the same address whose mail-in ballot also was not counted because of mismatched signatures. Among them was Bailey's 82-year-old wife, Carol.

The analysis also found that most of the Johnson County ballots discarded for signature problems — 108 — were from Republicans.

A new law is designed to reduce the number of ballots discarded for signature issues, a move that begins to peel back some of the most restrictive election laws in the country that were implemented by Kobach while he was secretary of state. Meanwhile, self-imposed changes in Johnson County essentially eased the practice for the 2018 general election.

The AP acquired the voting data after voting rights activist Davis Hammet and the American Civil Liberties Union of Kansas filed a formal court petition to get the list of primary voters whose ballots were rejected. A judge ruled that election officials had violated open records law by refusing to provide the names to Hammet. He shared with AP the list of voters, and the AP made open records requests to obtain additional data.

The exact-match signature requirement is a little-known provision of the Kansas Secure and Fair Elections Act championed by Kobach, who lost the gubernatorial race but is known nationally for his efforts to tighten voting laws with the stated goal of keeping ineligible people from voting. That legislation also ushered in a slew of restrictive voting laws such as voter ID at the polls and a proof-of-citizenship requirement for voter registration that has since been ruled unconstitutional.

The AP analysis highlights how counties differ in their implementation of the exact-match rule. In Sedgwick County, the state's second largest county and home to Wichita, no mail-in ballots were rejected in the 2018 primary due to signature mismatches. County Election Commissioner Tabitha Lehman said she has training in handwriting analysis and had instituted a process that favors voters and proactively reaches out to voters to fix signature issues.

In contrast, Johnson County hewed closely to Kobach's guidance on a strict reading of the signature issue.

Following the 2018 primary, Johnson County reviewed its procedures and found that of the 153 ballots not counted because of mismatched signatures, only 10 were determined not to be the signature of the named voter, according to Johnson County Election Commissioner Ronnie Metsker. He said the remaining 143 appeared to be spouses signing each other's ballot or the ballot of another household member.

The county's board of canvassers pushed for a change in the process with the goal of counting as many ballots as legally possible. Beginning in the 2018 general election, the county counted multiple ballots from the same household even if they had mismatched signatures, if it was apparent that members of the same household had switched envelopes and signed each other's envelope. His office also attempted to contact the voter to fix the signature before the board of canvassers met eight days later, Metsker said.

None of the Johnson County voters whose mail-in ballots were tossed out for signature mismatches in the 2018 primary had ballots rejected for mismatches in November's general election. In fact, the number of those rejected mismatched ballots plummeted to a dozen the 2018 general election. That compares to 325 ballots tossed for mismatched signatures in the 2016 general election and 109 rejected in the 2016 primary.

The political outcry over the hundreds of discarded mail-in ballots statewide in the 2018 primary led to legislation signed Monday by Democratic Gov. Laura Kelly that requires election officials to notify voters before their mail-in ballots are thrown out because of problems with signatures.

The new law also gives voters an additional week or longer to cure a signature issue until the canvass in each county. Voters previously had only until the end of Election Day to fix the problem.

"I hope this will be the first of many laws that help ensure that every voice is heard in our democratic process and that every vote is counted," Kelly said.

no estimates are yet available.

Councilmember Wells said, “We waited this long – it’s worth waiting for (to see the cost savings).” The council seemed to like this plan better and asked Hibbs to proceed.

Leone said OSHA came to inspect the city building since a citizen made a complaint. He said if asbestos is found it will make it impossible for the city crew and volunteers to do any demolition to save in the expense.

A Ransom Capital (bond company) rep sat through this meeting which to this point was about two hours. He could do nothing to discuss bond financing for the city hall project since there are not yet dollar figures to use.

Mower bids were on the agenda as City Superintendent Gary Johnson said the city’s mowers are from 2011 and “running hard.” John Deere representative Pat Myers was present to discuss the bids from Prairie Land

of Anthony. The city also received bids from Grasshopper from Bogner in Kiowa. After lengthy discussion about the bids, the council voted 5-0 to buy two (different size) Grasshoppers.

Tractor bids were also on the agenda as the current 2014 John Deere 5075E needs replaced. Bids were received from New Holland, John Deere and Kubota. After the council discussed the various bids they decided to fix their old tractor.

Paradise Ice requested to leave their trailer next to Kiowa’s baseball park this summer. Last year Paradise removed the trailer at the end of each day. Shaffer said he doesn’t like the competition to the concession stand run by the South Barber Rec Commission. Council voted to deny the request.


Fire Chief Bill Duvall told the council they have an 18-year-old senior who wants to join the department before he leaves for his

Defense awards Boeing \$14.3B bomber maintenance contract

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — Boeing Co. has won a \$14.3 billion contract to service and maintain all B-1 Lancer and B-52 Stratofortress bombers at Tinker Air Force Base in Oklahoma City.

The contract includes hardware and software development and integration, ground and flight testing, configuration management, studies and analyses and modernization, said the Department of Defense in a statement last week.

The agreement continues a Boeing contract awarded 10 years ago to service air-

craft at Tinker, which is a major part of the Air Force's maintenance, repair and overhaul network, The Oklahoman reported.

"That's great news for our workforce here," said Lori Rasmussen, a spokeswoman for Boeing. "Boeing's employment numbers in Oklahoma have been on an upward trend. They are expected to remain so. The bombers' modernization efforts will continue to play a significant role in the growth of the Oklahoma City site."

The Defense Department said it didn't solicit any other companies for the bomber

service contract at Tinker because Boeing is the original equipment manufacturer and has possession of all airframe and systems information.

Rasmussen said Boeing's first project under the new contract will be an advanced, high frequency communications integration study costing a projected \$1.2 million.

Maintenance of the B-21 Raider, a long-range stealth bomber expected to replace the B-1 and B-52 in the mid-2020s, will also take place at Tinker.

committing to change language in the bill before its final passage. The Oklahoma Constitution does not allow a bill to pass without a title or an enacting clause. Having a bill pass both the House and Senate without title or enacting clause is like shooting a gun with blanks. It may make the same noise as a real bullet but it cannot do anything but make noise. Both title and enacting clause must be restored before final passage of the bill in its chamber of origin and before it is sent to the governor who must then decide whether to sign it into law. Bills with title on and enacting clause in place are sometimes called "live rounds."

One item getting a lot of attention in our area is Senate Bill 868, which allows farmers to apply for a grower's license to produce industrial hemp from certified seeds. The measure authorizes the state Department of Agriculture to develop and administer a production program under the 2018 Federal Farm Bill. The problem with this is the Federal Farm Bill of 2018 doesn't go into effect until the fall of this year. Thus, anyone planting this year would not be able to receive any federal assistance set out by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). We are currently working with the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture and the USDA

to guarantee payment and coverage of the Farm Service Agency for those wanting to plant hemp this year. The pilot program looks to be extended to aid those wanting to plant hemp this year. The pilot program was put in place last year, under which state farmers had to partner with a state university in order to grow the crop. Farmers in western Oklahoma are very concerned about finding a solution to this program as hemp should be a good cash crop as other grain prices remain low. Please watch as we will try to solve this in the weeks to come to accommodate the farmers' need to get this crop in the ground in the next few weeks.

from an R-12 Contingency account for the remainder of FY 2018-2019 salaries.

The final transfer was from a T-2A Highway Maintenance and Operation Capital Outlay for District 3 for \$20,560 (per auditor) for salvaged metal. The auditor directed staff to deposit the money into the M&O account before transferring to T-3. It will be appropriated in May.

Next on the agenda was a detention services agreement by and between Sac and Fox Nation and Alfalfa County for FY 2019-2020, and it was approved unanimously. Before adjourning, three private property easements were approved; one at NW/4 of 19-28-8, and the others at SW/4 of 33-25-11 and SW 80 acres of 32-26-10.
