# Stolen welder located through social media post

A man reported a welder and trailer stolen from his property at Aline. Later a deputy saw a social media post listing the items for sale.

According to court records, on the morning of Oct. 10 Venn Charles Berg went to the Alfalfa County Sheriff's Office to report a welder and trailer stolen from his property. Berg stated his Lincoln Electric welder and the small home-built trailer it was on had been stolen.

Berg said the welder was last seen by his son on Saturday, Oct. 6, about 5 p.m. when he was parking a tractor inside the barn. Berg said he went by the barn on Monday and noticed the tractor had been moved but didn't think anything about it and didn't go in the barn area.

He told Deputy Diego Gutierrez the barn, located on County Road 610, was visible from the road but he had a stock trailer parked in front of the barn, blocking the view from the road. Berg said the welder was located in the back of the barn with the tractor parked in front of it. He said neither he nor his son had

been in the barn over the weekend, but he was aware his brother-in-law Randy Nickel stayed at a home located on the property on Sunday, Oct. 7. Berg said he kicked Nickel out of the property a few weeks prior because of the people he was allowing to be there.

Berg named two men he said had been on the property who helped Nickel move out. He said he wasn't certain they had stolen his welder but had heard from others they might be stealing property from people in the Kingfisher area. Berg said he didn't believe Nickel was responsible but he could have unknowingly let someone know there wasn't anyone living on the property.

On Oct. 15 Undersheriff Gary Mast provided Gutierrez with pictures from Facebook listing the welder and trailer for sale. The location was in Yukon. Gutierrez contacted the Canadian County Sheriff's Office who sent a deputy to the location. The deputy contacted Daniel Reggio at the location. The welder was identified by its serial number. Berg was contacted and advised he could pick

up the welder at the Canadian County Sheriff's Office.

Reggio stated he contacted a Nicole Hough on Facebook and arranged to meet her at a gas station in Enid to buy the welder from her. He said he was skeptical about the purchase and filmed the transaction. He said the woman he bought the welder from was accompanied by two men, and he was able to capture a face shot of one of the men and the vehicle they were in.

On Oct. 16 in Alfalfa County District Court, Nicole Elizabeth Hough, 32, of Cherokee, was charged with knowingly concealing stolen property and burglary in the second degree, both felonies. The first charge is punishable by imprisonment in the state penitentiary not to exceed five years, or in the county jail not to exceed one year, or by a fine not to exceed \$500, or by both fine and imprisonment. The second charge is punishable by imprisonment for two to seven years.

A warrant has been issued for Hough's arrest.

# Commissioners in Alfalfa County open and review bids

Commissioners in Alfalfa County met Monday morning with a much longer agenda than in weeks past. The three officials got down to business after the usual invocation and flag salute, approving previous meeting minutes and signing approved warrants for payment and blanket purchase orders. Three road-crossing permits were approved this week – two for District 2 totaling \$2,750 and the single permit in District 3 totaling \$250.

Quotes on both a Ford and Chevy sport-utility vehicle (for the sheriff's office from state contract) were looked at but no action was taken. Sealed bids were opened next, first on a 2003 Chevy pickup truck (Inv. #SJ13 301-100.01, Serial #1GCHK24U63E118955) and then a 1999 IHC 4700 C&C Truck (Inv. #SJ13 301-100.02, Serial #1HT-

5CAAM0XH630865). Both trucks would be purchased for Cherokee Rescuers. Commissioners reviewed the bids but tabled the matter to allow the rescuers time to look them over themselves.

The county's annual billing breakdown for the visual-inspection budget required no action except an acknowledgment that was ultimately given. Moving through the agenda, the officials appointed Jennifer Hensley as a Fair Board member to fulfill the term remainder on a seat that was recently resigned from.

A resolution approving the Interlocal Cooperative Agreement for the Circuit Engineering district was approved next with Commissioner Stan Tucker being designated to serve as the official board member for the eighth district.

Officials then mulled over dates and

schedules for 2019, including the holiday schedule, payroll due dates and meeting dates for county commissioners, Class A officers, and the excise board. Alfalfa County's 2019 handbook was approved as well, along with the 2019 drug/alcohol testing policy.

A small administrative correction was made to the equipment disposal resolution made Oct. 9 for a 2006 Chevy Impala, followed by commissioners declaring a 1999 John Deere Backhoe 310SE as surplus. The trio then assigned an end date of Nov. 2 for online bids on the 2014 Mini Dredge 2011 VMI MD-615HN.

Finally, a resolution to authorize an application for financial assistance from the Rural Economic Action Plan (REAP) fund was approved. The meeting adjourned after no new business was introduced.

# Carl's Capitol Comments

State Question 801, School Property Taxes to be used for School Operations



This is the final State Question that will be on the November Ballot. State Question 801 has to do with using ad valorem taxes to help with operations expenses at the secondary schools of

Oklahoma.

If passed, the 5 mill building fund could be used for operational purposes as deemed necessary by a school district. So there is no new money being generated by this proposition it is just broadening how the building fund

money can be used. Currently, building fund money can only be used for building remodeling, building repairs, building maintenance, utilities and maintenance staff.

Currently, ad valorem tax (a tax based on the assessed value of an item such as real estate or personal property) is used for various purposes. This tax is levied by a vote of the people in many cases. Ad valorem funds: schools, county government, cities, county health departments, and Career Tech.

Currently, individual school can levy up to 39 mills to support general operations of the school and up to 5 mills for the building fund. For a point of reference, a mill is 1/1000 of a dollar or better explained \$1 for every \$1,000 of value. In the case of 39 mills, schools currently get \$39 for every \$1,000 of valuation of real property for operations and can vote in an additional \$5 for every \$1,000 valuation for the building fund.

One of the concerns raised by opponents of this proposition, if schools operations (teacher's salaries, auxiliary

staff, or other personnel) are dependent on this tax what funds will be available to maintain the school's buildings.

Proponents of the proposition say it gives some schools a better chance to be more competitive with other schools. This money could be used to attract teachers and other professionals in to coming to their school districts.

The final question comes in deciding if the building fund money should be used for operations. The question is this the best avenue to get more money into our schools. The education of our children is very important; I just want to make sure we aren't doing one thing at the risk of another.

# Brewer: 1<sup>st</sup> day of hearing

BARBER COUNTY, Kan. (KWCH) – According to a less lethal weapon expert, Barber County Undersheriff Virgil “Dusty” Brewer used a beanbag round bought on the internet from a man in Michigan. The expert says the round was 4-5 times faster than a standard round.

That round would kill Steven Myers in Sun City in 2017.

“It’s not a less lethal round, by definition,” Steven Ijames said. Ijames has conducted roughly 3,000 less lethal tests and was asked by the Kansas Attorney General to perform those tests in this case.

But Ijames said he couldn’t complete a less lethal test because the round was less lethal.

Ijames said standard police beanbag rounds are 40 grams. Brewer’s was 25 grams.

Ijames said standard police beanbag rounds travel just under 300 feet per second. Brewer’s traveled at a range of 1,220-1,490 feet per second.

Ijames also said the beanbag rounds came from a man in Michigan whose mother would sew these rounds in a bedroom. Ijames said the man sold them online without anywhere close to the required warnings.

This information came from a preliminary hearing for a Kansas Undersheriff charged in the death of a man who was shot and killed with a beanbag round in Barber County.

Undersheriff Virgil “Dusty” Brewer is charged with involuntary manslaughter in the death of Steven Myers.

This morning, the court heard from Ted Alexander, who was at Buster’s the day Steven Myers was there. Alexander testified he had known Myers most of his life, and that Myers was a bit agitated that day.

Alexander testified that Myers got mad when he came back from the bathroom and wasn’t sure where his drink was. Alexander says Myers got onto the bar with a stool, and it appeared as though he was going to throw it.

Eventually, people were able to get Myers outside, and there was some commotion.

The dispatcher who took the initial 911 call from Alexander that day also testified about what happened that day.

The court then heard from Barber County Sheriff Lonnie Small. He explained how he hired Undersheriff Brewer. He says Brewer had ten years of law enforcement experience and passed a background check.

Sheriff Small testified about beanbag rounds, which Undersheriff Brewer carried. He said he did not know if Brewer had been trained on using the beanbag rounds, and that his office does not have any specific policy outside of the regular use of force policy.

The court also saw body camera footage from Sheriff Small’s body camera the day of the shooting, before heading into the noon recess.

Out of the break, Small discussed the response to Myers’ home. He said when he was at the back door of the home, he saw a person standing parallel to a shed door. He he could only see the front of someone’s torso and he assumed this “someone” was Myers.

Small said he went to the front of the house because he didn’t want to be standing in the doorway. He said he did this for protection and then heard what he assumed was a beanbag-round shot, but didn’t know for sure.

The sheriff stepped down before cross-examination, but will return Wednesday to finish his testimony.

Pratt County Undersheriff Max Barrett then took the stand. He talked about arriving on the scene and thought deputies were still looking for Myers. He said he learned they had him and that Myers was bleeding and first responders were performing CPR. Barrett said he called the Kansas Bureau of Investigation per Small’s request.

Barrett said he saw the shell casing from the bean bag round and said it was strange because the casing was clear with no writing on it. He said normally, commercial beanbag rounds are labeled to show the company that made them. He said he mentioned this to Small and said, “it didn’t look quite right.”

Barrett said he and Small went to Brewer’s vehicle and found three other rounds. One had a company name on it. The other two were clear without writing. He said he opened a clear when when Small asked him to do so.

Applications for absentee ballots must be received by the county election board no later than 5 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 31, to be processed in time for the election.

Absentee voters may apply in person at the county election board office located at 602 W. 5<sup>th</sup> St., Ste. 3, Cherokee or may send their applications by mail, fax or e-mail. An online version of the form may be filled out and submitted electronically at [www.elections.ok.gov](http://www.elections.ok.gov). Any registered voter eligible to vote in the election may vote by absentee

ballot without stating a reason, Stein said, however absentee voters can activate certain special conditions in the following circumstances:

- Registered voters who are physically incapacitated and voters who care for physically incapacitated persons who cannot be left unattended may apply for absentee ballots only by mail, fax, e-mail, online or via an agent who is at least 16 years of age and who is not employed by or related within the third degree of consanguinity or affinity to any person whose name appears on the ballot.

- Registered voters who are confined to nursing homes in the county may apply by mail, fax, e-mail, online or via an agent who is at least 16 years of age and who is not employed by or related

within the third degree of consanguinity or affinity to any person whose name appears on the ballot.

- Military personnel, residents of Alfalfa County living overseas, and the spouses and dependents of each group may apply only by mail, fax or e-mail. # Bible Museum admits some of its Dead Sea Scrolls are fake

WASHINGTON (AP) — When Washington's \$500 million Museum of the Bible held its grand opening in November 2017, attended by Vice President Mike Pence, there were questions even then about the authenticity of its centerpiece collection of Dead Sea Scrolls.

Now the museum has been forced to admit a painful truth: Technical analysis by a team of German scholars has revealed that at least five of the museum's 16 scroll fragments are apparent forgeries.

The announcement has serious implications not only for the Bible Museum but for other evangelical Christian individuals and institutions who paid top dollar for what now seems to be a massive case of archaeological fraud.

Jeffrey Kloha, chief curator for the Museum of the Bible, said in a statement that the revelation is "an opportunity to educate the public on the importance of verifying the authenticity

of rare biblical artifacts, the elaborate testing process undertaken and our commitment to transparency."

The scrolls are a collection of ancient Jewish religious texts first discovered in the mid-1940s in caves on the western shore of the Dead Sea in what is now Israel. The massive cache of Hebrew documents is believed to date back to the days of Jesus. With more than 9,000 documents and 50,000 fragments, the entire collection took decades to fully excavate.

Most of the scrolls and fragments are tightly controlled by the Israeli Antiquities Authority. But around 2002, a wave of new fragments began mysteriously appearing on the market, despite skepticism from Biblical scholars.

These fragments, they warned, were specifically designed to target American evangelical Christians, who prize the scrolls. That appears to be exactly what happened; a Baptist seminary in Texas and an evangelical

college in California reportedly paid millions to purchase alleged pieces of the scrolls.

Also eagerly buying up fragments was the Green family — evangelical Oklahoma billionaires who run the Hobby Lobby chain of craft stores and who famously sued the Obama administration on religious grounds, saying they didn't want to pay to provide their employees access to the morning-after pill or intrauterine devices.

The Greens are the primary backers of the Museum of the Bible and went on an archaeological acquisition spree in the years leading up to the museum's opening. In addition to the alleged Dead Sea Scrolls fragments, the Greens ran afoul of the Justice Department, which said they had acquired thousands of smuggled artifacts looted from Iraq and elsewhere. The family agreed last year to return those artifacts and pay a \$3 million fine.

## Oklahoma police find 1,262 pounds of liquid meth

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) — Two people are in custody after authorities in Oklahoma found 1,262 pounds of liquid methamphetamine in the fuel tank of a tractor-trailer truck.

The Norman Police Department says the meth was found in a diesel-powered semi-truck that was parked at a motel Monday morning.

Authorities say 1,262 pounds of liquid meth was stored in the truck's passenger-side fuel tank. Police estimated the street value of the drug at \$4.4 million and say it was one of the largest drug seizures recorded in Oklahoma.

Authorities say the truck driver, 36-year-old Enrique Lara of Chicago, and a passenger, 21-year-old Jasmine Morales of McAllen, Texas, were arrested on a complaint of aggravated trafficking. Cleveland County Jail records do not indicate if they are represented by an attorney.

## Police video captures Oklahoma suspect stealing patrol car

TULSA, Okla. (AP) — Police in Oklahoma have released video of a handcuffed woman driving off in a patrol car.

Tulsa police say 37-year-old Angie Frost was taken into custody March 30 on suspicion of driving a stolen car. An officer handcuffed Frost and placed her in the front seat of his patrol car while he searched the vehicle she had been driving.

Body camera video shows officers standing next to the patrol car when one notices Frost is in the driver's seat. "What is she doing?" the officer says.

Another replies: "She's trying to steal your car."

Dashcam video shows Frost driving away. Authorities say Frost eventually pulled over. Video shows her being taken back into custody.

Records indicate she's serving a three-year prison sentence after pleading guilty in May to larceny and other charges.

## Jury convicts Kansas doctor in drug distribution conspiracy

WICHITA, Kan. (AP) — A federal jury has convicted a Kansas doctor accused of unlawfully prescribing pain medication blamed in one patient's death.

The U.S. attorney's office said in a news release that 57-year-old Steven R. Henson of Wichita was convicted Tuesday of unlawfully distributing methadone and alprazolam, the use of which resulted in the death of a victim on July 24, 2015.

The doctor was also convicted of conspiracy to distribute prescription drugs outside the course of medical practice, unlawfully distributing various prescription drugs, presenting false patient records to investigators, obstruction of justice and money laundering.

Prosecutors alleged at trial that Henson wrote prescriptions in return for cash, post-dated prescriptions and wrote prescriptions without a medical need or legitimate medical exam.

Sentencing will be set at a later date.

## Woman freed from prison early over calls recorded in Kansas

KANSAS CITY, Kan. (AP) — A Texas woman serving time in federal prison has been released early because a former prosecutor listened to recorded phone calls between her and her attorney.

The Kansas City Star reports that 37-year-old Michelle Reulet is one of potentially dozens of defendants who could be affected by a pending federal court case over recorded calls at a privately run detention center in Leavenworth, Kansas.

Reulet left prison Monday after U.S. District Judge Daniel Crabtree in Kansas City, Kansas, ordered her release. She was serving a five-year sentence for mail fraud and was not due for release until September 2020.

Defense attorneys allege federal prosecutors regularly obtained recordings of attorney-client phone calls in violation of their clients' constitutional rights. Prosecutors contend there were a few isolated instances such as Reulet's case.

# Kansas Honor Flight an ‘emotional’ experience for nine area veterans

*Purple Heart recipient Anderson chosen to lay wreath at Tomb of the Unknown Soldier*

Having the privilege to interview nine veterans who took the most recent Kansas Honor Flight (65<sup>th</sup>) found raw emotion among eight men and one woman as if their service was yesterday.

The word “emotional” was used numerous times by each as they described the royal treatment they received on their three-day journey to Washington, D.C., and the heroes’ “welcome home” that embraced them upon return to the Eisenhower Airport in Wichita.

A man playing bagpipes leading the veterans down the hallway to a cheering crowd of family and friends with literally cheerleaders along the way in a sea of red, white and blue balloons, posters and streamers, and politicians like Kansas’ U.S. Congressman Ron Estes saying a few kind words and more was the scene Friday afternoon. Even Kiowa’s Mayor Ron Rohr had a “note” of congratulations.

This was the total opposite of what many veterans experienced when

coming home from war – especially those who served in Vietnam. Veteran Buddy Anderson recalled when arriving at the Norton Air Force Base, “protesters threw stuff at us like pop cans, spit at us and yelled that we were baby killers.”

The Kansas Honor Flight is an all-volunteer organization that works to honor veterans of World War II, the Korean War and Vietnam. This is all-expense paid trip to Washington, D.C., for the veterans to see their memorials. The organization also works to educate the youth and communities throughout Kansas about the impact of these historic wars and the freedoms that America enjoys because of the service of its veterans.

Former honor flight attendee Jim Powell of Hardtner is instrumental in gathering donations from individuals to help fund Kansas Honor Flight. He also helps organize to see that area veterans make the trip. A Korean War veteran who was in the Army and served in 1951-52, Powell went on the 49<sup>th</sup> Kansas Honor

Flight. He described the “welcome home” as “really emotional” for him and said, “There were lots of old men with tears in their eyes.”

“I want to thank the communities for their financial contributions,” Powell said of the Kansas towns of Kiowa, Medicine Lodge, Hardtner, Hazelton and down into Oklahoma in the Alva area. He said there are about 300 veterans on the waiting list. Two flights remain in 2018.

Those veterans attending the Kansas Honor Flight last week from Kiowa were: Buddy Anderson, Dennis Christensen, Bob Drake, Mike Hiltner, Linda Holt, Buddy Ligenstoffer and Syd Stranathan; and from Hazelton, Tom Traylor and Ken Weber.

In individual interviews, each veteran gave the highest praise to KHF President Mike VanCampen and his wife Connie who accompanied them on the trip.





Anderson was a Marine from 1968-70, serving in Vietnam from 1969-70. A truck driver, his truck hit a land mine that swung his truck around. The explosion caused shrapnel to pierce his chest, an injury for which he received a Purple Heart.

The highlight of the KHF for Anderson was getting to represent the Marines and lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington Cemetery.

“That was a very honorable thing for me. Wow!” Anderson said that while placing the wreath, he felt “chills, tears – everything.”

Anderson opened up about his feelings and said “the worst thing about coming home from Vietnam was the nightmares – seeing little kids in front of my truck.” He said the honor flight “was educational, but mainly emotional.”

Of this quick trip to D.C., he said his favorite was seeing the National Archives and Fort McHenry, the place where American soldiers had a crucial victory over British forces in the War of 1812. With the American flag still standing the next morning, Francis Scott Key was inspired to write the Star Spangled Banner. He said, “The big canons are still in place.”

Anderson said, “Everyone needs to go see our monuments in our nation’s capitol. It’s awesome.”

### Dennis Christensen Returns This Time as a Veteran

Christensen remembers being drafted on Pearl Harbor Day and serving in the Army during the Vietnam War from 1966-68.

He was on one of the KHFs earlier when he went to chauffeur his father, “Dr. Chris,” longtime doctor at the Kiowa District Hospital. A highlight for him in this recent trip was seeing the World War II Memorial with the fountains working as they were not on his first visit. He also liked getting to see the Lincoln Memorial more and all of that beloved president’s historical words etched into the stone.

At the Arlington National Cemetery, Christensen said he was impressed to see the tomb of Audie Murphy (1925–1971). Murphy was one of the most decorated American combat soldiers of World War II. He received every military combat award for valor available from the U.S. Army, as well as French and Belgian awards for heroism. Murphy received the Medal of Honor for valor that he demonstrated at the age of 19 for single-handedly holding off an entire company of German soldiers for an hour at the Colmar Pocket in France in January 1945, then leading a successful counterattack while wounded and out of ammunition.

### Bob Drake Said ‘One of Best Experiences of My Life’

As a member of the Army, Drake served in Vietnam in 1968-69. This honor flight was his first time to D.C.

A self-described history buff, he loved learning about the history of each memorial.

“The people who put this on – I don’t have the words or the time to describe how they went out of their way for us. It was perfect,” Drake said. The whole thing was “so organized.” He loves that no tax dollars are involved – it’s strictly donation. He was impressed with the generosity of Southwest Airlines who donates about 25 flights for every KHF, he said.

The surprise “mail call” at the banquet was over the top for Drake. When he was given a pile of mail from his family, friends and students, he said, “It was absolutely mind-blowing,” and added, “I owe everyone a big thank you.” He started reading the letters but said he was so overcome with emotion, he couldn’t finish them all that night.

Drake said he loved the entire trip, including the war memorials; especially visiting the National Archives and Fort McHenry. “I advise other veterans to get your application in. You’ll never forget it. This trip was one of the best experiences of my life.”

### Mike Hiltner Says Trip Was ‘Tremendous’

Hiltner is commander of Kiowa’s VFW Post 5982. He served in the Army from 1969 to 1973. He was a helicopter mechanic and spent one year in Vietnam, 1970-71.

Hiltner has been to the D.C. area twice before this honor flight, but said, “Every time you go back, it’s that much more impressive to how significant it all is to our country.” For example he said he had never before visited Fort McHenry where the canons and everything are still intact. McHenry was an aide to General George Washington during the Revolution.

“This put the final piece of the puzzle in for me,” Hiltner said of visiting Fort McHenry. In reference to the mail call, Hiltner said, “I doubt there was a dry eye.”

Referring to the entire trip and the KHF team, Hiltner said, “This is not a trip we went on. We were taken. It was like heaven. They did everything for us.



At least 25 wheelchairs were available at all times if needed. It was pretty impressive.” He was impressed to learn of the seats Southwest Airlines donates and the meals donated by Golden Corral.

“I impress upon anyone to go,” Hiltner said. “The whole thing was tremendous.”

### **Buddy Ligenstoffer Says It Was ‘Tour of a Lifetime’**

Ligenstoffer was an Army aviation pilot with a military career spanning from 1965 to 1993. He served two tours in Vietnam, two tours in Korea and one in Germany. He described the honor flight trip as “a tour of a lifetime” and said, “All vets need to go.”

Ligenstoffer has been to D.C., several times previously. “The memorials were nice. The whole honor flight was “great, fantastic and emotional.”

“What really impressed me was Mike VanCampen and his whole group. They are amazing. Kansas has one of the best honor flights. I’ve met some veterans from other states who said what they have is nothing like ours.”

“Everywhere we went they they had people to cheer for us. It was really something.” Ligenstoffer said he really liked the Arlington Cemetery, watching the posting of colors and seeing Buddy Anderson laying the wreath.

### **Linda Holt Receives Honor Medallion**

Holt was the only female veteran on the trip. She was in the Army and was a WAC (Womens Army Corp) and was a medical tech. She served during Vietnam but was stationed at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, at the Womack Army Hospital.

She was surprised on the trip with an honor medallion at the “welcome home” celebration. Her brother Doug Vannaman placed the medallion of thanks around her neck. It says “You wrote a blank check to the United States of America for an amount up to and including your life.”

On the Washington Memorial tour, Holt said she most loved the Vietnam Wall. A friend of her brother’s from Medicine Lodge, George Long, was a soldier in Vietnam and was killed there. Her voice cracked as she told of finding

his name and etching it from the wall. Her sister Vicky Purdy was her escort for the trip. "It meant a lot to us," she said.

Their father Cecil Vannaman was a Marine in WWII so seeing the Iwo Jima statue "was meaningful" to the sisters. She said VanCamp pointed out there are only six men so there would just be 12 hands, yet 13 sets of hands show. The 13<sup>th</sup> set of hands are said to be the hands of God," VanCamp told them.

Holt said the "outstanding" mail call brought a flood of emotions when "people sent us beautiful, beautiful letters." She mentioned the impressive "water salute" over their airplane as did several of the other veterans.

The KHF was "a once-in-a-lifetime trip," Holt said. She commented on what "an exceptional" bus driver they had on this "fast-moving trip."

### Tom Traylor Liked the Welcome

Traylor was a ground mechanic in the Air Force from 1966-69 and took care of all types of planes. He was with the 461<sup>st</sup> Bomb Wing in Amarillo, Texas, that took the first B-52s that touched down on Asian soil. His tour was in Thailand. Later, as president of the Architectural Woodworks Institute, he toured Washington.

"It was nothing like the tour we took," with the KHF. "Mike was a great tour guide." The "most meaningful" site for Traylor was the Marine Corps War Memorial. He said Iwo Jima "was one of the best." He also liked the Korean

War Memorial, the World War II Memorial and the Vietnam Wall where he recognized some names.

Referring to the water salute where your plane passes through arches of water, Traylor said the pilot told him that's the first time he's had that happen twice.

"It was quite a trip. The number of people who greeted us was impressive," Traylor said. "When we returned from southeast Asia there was nothing."

### Ken Weber

As an infantryman in the Army, Weber remembers walking the rice patties in the jungle of Vietnam during his one year there through his service from 1967-69.

"I was one of the fortunate ones," Weber said. He still wonders about a buddy who pointed out a booby trap to him and was then hit himself by a "pineapple grenade" leaving many holes in his upper body. He patched him up as much as possible before medics arrived. "So many died there," Weber said.

He had never before been to the nation's capitol. He described the trip as "awesome and overwhelming." Describing "the huge granite and marble buildings," Weber said, "I've never seen so many historical places at once." He commented on the "excellent bus driver" who had been driving for 44 years.

He said McHenry was "neat" and Arlington was overwhelming. He said the changing of the guard there

"really impressed me." He expressed appreciation to the many people who welcomed the veterans.

### Dr. Sid Stranathan

Dr. Sid Stranathan spent a year in Vietnam as a medic in the Army during his service in 1970-71. He worked out in the field and thankfully the only injury he sustained was a piece of shrapnel that pierced his helmet and caused a concussion.

Speaking of the KHF, Stranathan said, "I can't say enough good about Mike, Connie and their crew. The trip was very well done." Having them explain in detail was helpful. For example, Stranathan said how much he enjoyed the changing of the guard at Arlington Cemetery. Had the crew not told the group that when one of the soldiers/guards scuffs his shoe beside you that is a salute, they would have had no way of knowing.

Stranathan thanked local veteran Don Kuenzi for encouraging other veterans to take the honor flight after he enjoyed one recently. Like others, he was impressed with the airline and restaurant gifts and said Hilton hotels also donated some of the rooms.

"Parts of the trip were emotional – especially the mail call that stirred memories," Stranathan said.

He said the welcome in Baltimore with over 200 people cheering for the veterans was a "great start."

"The welcome in Wichita was special," he said "I'm so glad I went."



When he did this, Barrett said, the round appeared to have denim that was sewn into a zigzag pattern. Barrett said the round looked homemade.

He said he later spoke with Brewer who was shaken up. He said the Brewer seemed calm, but was upset.

When Barrett first saw Brewer, he said the undersheriff was running by him to get a trauma kit. Later on the scene, he said he saw that Brewer still had on his Kevlar vest.

Barrett said Brewer had his service weapon on him, but only deployed the beanbag round. Barrett also checked the less-lethal gun and in that, only found beanbag rounds.

Barrett explained the 21-foot rule, which states that a person with a weapon can typically cover 21 feet of space to an officer before the officer can adequately react.

Barrett said he never saw a weapon near Myers and was not told by anyone at the time that Myers may have had a weapon. Prosecutors asked if an officer can shoot if they believe someone may have concealed a weapon. Barrett said, "no."

Latham took the stand after the Pratt County Undersheriff. The hearing continues tomorrow (Wednesday).

## Oklahoma to start new unit to investigate 1,200 cold cases

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — A new unit within the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation will help tackle more than 1,200 cold cases, agency officials said

The bureau plans to open its Cold Case Unit next month, The Oklahoman reported. The unit will consist of a bureau investigator and a crime analyst who will examine cases dating back to 1950. The agency chose the date based on the likelihood of suspects still being alive.

New technology and investigative tools can help investigators solve cold cases, the bureau said.

"Over the years, there were cases that there may not have been enough evidence at the time to prosecute, or the evidence we had at the time we may not have had the technology to completely vet it," said Ricky Adams, the bureau's director. "In many cases

today, we have some of that, so we're looking to go back and try to capitalize on that."

The unit will work with law enforcement jurisdictions around Oklahoma to help solve cases, officials said.

"We're going to ask outside agencies how many cases they have so we can dedicate resources to helping solve them," said Andrea Fielding, director of criminalistics with the bureau.

Adams said investigators are dedicated to getting families answers.

"We don't care who puts the cuffs on a bad guy, we just want to make sure that these families get answers and we can find justice to speak for those people who can no longer speak for themselves," Adams said.

The agency hopes lawmakers will give additional funding to expand the program in the coming years.
