




# What is occupational therapy?

If you've been working at skipping occupational therapy services at Share Medical Center while enduring a lengthy hospital visit, this thought is for you.

About three weeks ago while I was still in the hospital, a cute young lady showed up with an occupational therapy certificate, which is included in the OTA certificate and took three years to complete. This was not the first time anyone had mentioned to me anything about a need for physical therapy (we are in good shape in Alva for that), but I had not heard about occupational or OT services.

I couldn't imagine what she could teach me about journalism or photography, my occupations. But the skills she wanted me to practice were in the realm of life skills, everyday actions like lifting groceries or doing laundry.

She announced she had a Halloween-



themed set of exercises for me and she had five or six clients who were to be the subject of occupational therapy. Internally my reaction was "Do I REALLY need to be painting a face on a pumpkin?" My first thought was to concoct in my mind secret reasons why it wouldn't be wise for me.

When the time came for my appointment, I decided to be a "good sport" and demonstrate what a fine pumpkin painter I would become for my OT for that week, Darlene Snyder.

As a news person, I'm always on the alert for news items so I discussed occupational therapy with Darlene. She is quite sold on OT and says Share Medical Center has a perfect spare room located in the basement that could become the OT room. If the board approved and separated the spare area for OT the Alva hospital could become the "Taj Mahal" of occupational therapy in that spare room. She believes this could attract people to Alva much like the specialty clinics in other hospitals.

Darlene said occupational therapy helps seniors and stroke patients recover their life skills such as loading a shelf with groceries and removing fresh clothes from a dryer. After several one-hour workouts, the patient may recover some of those life skills.

One of the ideas for an OT space might seem absurd: an electronic Wii game that

mixes fun with relearning movements. Offered as a form of therapy, it's an enjoyable way to get people moving. It's also an activity that could be continued at home with grandparents interacting with grandchildren in competitions.

Between physical therapy and occupational therapy, I came home from the hospital with improved muscle tone and a reminder to keep moving to build up my strength.

## School board candidate filing set to begin Monday, Dec. 3

Candidates for the boards of education in nine Alfalfa County school districts will file their Declarations of Candidacy beginning at 8 a.m. on Monday, Dec. 3, and continue on Tuesday, Dec. 4, and Wednesday, Dec. 5, Alfalfa County Election Board Secretary Kelly Stein said today.

Stein said the official filing period ends at 5 p.m. on Wednesday, Dec. 5. All candidate filings will occur at the Alfalfa County Election Board office, 602 W. 5<sup>th</sup> St., Ste. 3, in Cherokee, Stein said.

The primary school elections are scheduled for Feb. 12, 2019, only when more than two candidates file for office.

If a candidate receives more than 50 percent of the total votes cast in the primary election they will be elected, and no general election will be held in April.

If no candidates receive a majority of the votes cast at the primary election, the two candidates with the highest number of votes will appear on the ballot at the board of education general election on the first Tuesday in April.

If only two candidates file for an

office, they will appear on the ballot at the board of education general election on April 2, 2019. No primary election will be held in this circumstance.

- Timberlake School District – Office No. 4 (five-year term)

- Chisholm School District – Office No. 4 (five-year term)
- Medford School District – Office No. 4 (five-year term)
- Ringwood School District – Office No. 4 (five-year term)
- Northwest Technology Center – Zone No. 4 (five-year term)



# Extension Specialist Jim Rhodes announces retirement


After over 30 years of service to the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service and the people of Oklahoma, Jim Rhodes has announced his retirement.

# Kaynette Scheck selected for South Barber Elementary Teacher of the Year

*Qualifies Scheck to contend for state teacher of the year; Helping students 'believe'*

Sitting in Kaynette Scheck's fourth-grade classroom for a lunchtime interview finds a teacher who is as excited about her students' learning as the self-proclaimed "outdoor girl" is about her family tradition of rodeo – team roping.

As her students enter their classroom from lunch and recess, it's apparent from their hugs and wanting to linger around their teacher that she is beloved by them.

"I love helping them (students) believe they can when they think they can't," Scheck said.

In education 15 years, this is Scheck's fourth year to teach at South Barber Elementary School in Kiowa, Kansas. Her peers at the K-6<sup>th</sup> grade selected her as the Teacher of the Year. This recognition allows Scheck's application for the Kansas State Teacher of the Year.

South Barber Elementary Building Coordinator Adam Maloney wrote, "Mrs. Scheck not only sets the bar high for her students, but also her peers. Her dedication to the profession is evident through the myriad of hours she logs outside of her contracted time, both before and after school. Mrs. Scheck's in-

class organization is such that one wonders how she has time to write and memorize a script for every second of the day, as her presentation of material and attention to detail is so meticulously planned. Her contribution and leadership is present in multiple initiatives here at South Barber."

Teaching 24 fourth graders, Scheck said, "This year is going really well." When asked about what is included in fourth graders' curriculum, she said she teaches all four operations of math – problem solving. In social studies they learn all 50 states and capitols. Science covers energy, motion, the scientific method and electricity. She said students have fun designing a flashlight.

"By fourth grade we are no longer just teaching reading. Students are reading to learn," she said.

The biggest challenge Scheck said she faces as a teacher is students are expected to learn more at a faster pace. Yet, she said the majority of kids come to school every day with more real-life challenges and stress stemming from drugs, divorced families and more.

Each Friday she holds a "class council" for kids to discuss topics such as bullying and other timely subject matter. They set goals to help improve their situation.

In his first year as superintendent at South Barber, Dr. Mylo Miller said, "It is tremendously important when your fellow colleagues select you and recognize that Ms. Scheck is a great teacher. She is charismatic and committed to her students. We are proud that Ms. Scheck can represent the district on behalf of all our hard-working teachers. She is willing to get involved, speak up, and take on leadership roles. I find the work of a teacher to be inspiring and a great teacher can change a school and a community. Reading some of the Facebook posts on our district page about Ms. Scheck and her teaching, it becomes clear that she valued and was valued by her mentors and made a lifelong impact on her students!"

The following is an excerpt from a post Scheck's para Jessica Swonger wrote on Facebook about her, "Getting to be in your room and watch the love for learning and the love for your kids flow through you puts a smile on my face daily and warms my heart. The way you water our kids and help them blossom with your amazing talent for teaching and by being a truly caring individual you have made me fall in love with my job

# Alfalfa County courthouse restroom debacle causes major stink

There wasn't much to the agenda for Alfalfa County commissioners this week. Just as they do every week, Jay Hague, Stan Tucker and Ray "Toby" Walker sat at the meeting table and got down to business, starting with items of a routine nature. The trio took time to review the minutes from last week's meeting, ultimately signing off on them, along with the maintenance and operation warrants for payment. After examining the large stack of blanket purchase orders, a motion to approve was made and accepted. Hague's District 1 had one road crossing permit for \$250, Tucker's District 2 secured a single for \$5,000 while Walker's District 3 had two totaling \$2,500.

After what commissioners playfully call "signing their life away" on the abundance of paperwork, they declared surplus on a 2009 John Deere mower from District 2 (Invoice D2 441-212, serial no. W0HX154015497) a 2012 John Deere/Flex Wing/HX 15 (Invoice D2 441-214, serial no. 1POHX15FJBT030338), a 2013 John Deere Mower/Flex Wing/CX 15, and

a 2013 John Deere Mower/Flex Wing/CX 15 (Invoice D2 441-217, serial no. 1P0CX-15FTDT043096).

Commissioners agreed to go out for six-month bids before adjourning.

The meeting this week and its happenings were a lot less colorful than the spirited discussion that took place last Monday. The courthouse restroom facilities were a hot topic, as the women's private employee bathroom was vandalized in a way that was upsetting to commissioners and custodial staff. The officials said a large amount of toilet paper was strewn about and, worse yet, blood was left behind on the stool and sink area.

Though the restroom is kept unlocked and can be easily accessed by the general public, officials were leaning toward the idea that it may have been the deliberate work of a courthouse employee. No official accusations have been made, but cameras in the hallway may help in determining who was responsible for the incident.

Hague said if it were to happen again, the restroom would be locked and employ-

ees would have to use the public facilities instead.

To add to the situation, upper level restrooms of the courthouse had been causing problems of their own. An offensive odor, likened to the smell of decomposition, had been emanating from both the men and women's bathrooms. Inspections were done on them both, but the source of the smell wasn't discovered.

Other than the discussion on restrooms, the rest of last week's meeting was routine. Commissioners approved a donation of 40 hours sick leave from Keith Harmon to Charles Stephens. Surplus was declared on a 911 position one computer (Invoice R218.100.08, serial no. 2VA21454Q), a 911 position two computer (Invoice #R218.100.01, serial no. 2UA24525TK), and a 911 server (Invoice R218.100.05, Model J9623A). A resolution for disposal was approved for each of those items.

Lastly, the Criteria for Safety Incentives (2019) and the agreement by and between Sequoyah Enterprises Inc. and Alfalfa County were both approved.

# Winter Calving Management School

With calving season just around the corner, farmers and ranchers are spending every ounce of daylight to prepare feed, hay, shelter(s) and many other minute details to ensure their cows have the best possibility for a safe, stress-free birth come winter.

In a joint partnership between Kingman, Barber, Kiowa, Stafford, Pratt and Reno extension councils, one of six statewide winter calving management schools will be offered at the Kingman Expo Center, located at 121 South Main, in Kingman, Kansas, on Thursday, Dec. 13.

Attendees will have the pleasure of

hearing from Dr. A.J. Tarpoff, DVM, Extension beef veterinarian, on what it takes to prepare not only your cows and heifers, but yourself for potentially stressful situations during calving. Often, ranchers ask themselves “When should I intervene?” or “How am I supposed to help her [cow] if the calf presents itself abnormally?”

Dr. Tarpoff will spend time discussing the multiple calf presentations, how to safely intervene and deliver, as well as developing a system for a lifetime of health and performance for the calf. Dr. Tarpoff will also provide an in-depth, hands on look at different calving situations you may come across and how to handle those with a life-

sized demonstration cow and calf that mocks real calving situations for your educational benefit.

This program is for all cattle producers (regardless the size of their herd), extension professionals, animal science students, veterinarians and all interested individuals in the area. Registration will begin at 11 a.m. in the North Room of the Kingman Expo Center with the program scheduled to begin at 11:30 a.m. Enjoy lunch before diving into the hands-on practical methods of calving.

# Power outages questioned, architect hired for Kiowa City Hall remodel, Burn Time Nov. 26-Dec. 9

*DARE Speaker 'Retro Bill' to make public appearances in Kiowa Tuesday, Dec. 27, 7 p.m. for public; Meeting dates changed to second Monday of every month; Kiowa's 'Christmas in the Heartland' Open House and Parade Dec. 9; Four-day weekend Christmas and New Year's holidays for city employees*

A variety of business was conducted at the Kiowa City Council regular November meeting from approving an architect for the city hall remodel to approving a variety of Christmas-related items.

Mayor Ron Rohr opened the meeting in his traditional way by leading the group in the Lord's Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance. All councilmen attended the meeting including: Bill Watson, R.L. Simpson, Russ Molz, Brian Hill and Tom Wells. Also seated at the council table were City Administrator Lou Leone, City Attorney Laurel McClellan and City Utility Clerk Lynette Callison. She recorded the minutes as City Clerk Trish Brewer was absent.

### Power Outages Questioned on Public Agenda

Kiowa resident Anita Patterson spoke during the public comment period. Saying she's 80 years old, Patterson said, "We used to have dependable lines. Now it does it all the time." She questioned, "Why doesn't it get fixed?"

Leone explained the cold wind and storm caused the lines to sag. He said that 13 miles of line from the Burlington

sub-station goes over open farm ground. He showed piece of electrical line that had snapped in the wind and the core that was damaged. The city generators had to be turned on and then in the middle of repairs a few more outages occurred. The city administrator apologized for the inconvenience.

Mayor Rohr reiterated that it takes city crews near two hours to check city electrical lines to insure everyone's safety before firing up the city generators. The city had drained the city generator fuel tanks and disposed of it properly at the county landfill. With the new fuel the men said the generators are just "purrin'."

Patterson said she appreciated the explanation.

### 'Fifth Quarter' Nights for Youth Nov. 30 and Feb. 1

As she addressed council on the public agenda, business woman and member of REBOUND, Chantae Simpson thanked the city for their work on the electric lines.

The local REBOUND group plans Fifth Quarter nights after home basketball games Nov. 30 and Feb. 1. This is a place youth can congregate after the games. The council granted approval for REBOUND to hold those Fifth Quarter events in Kiowa's Community Building on those dates from 9 p.m. to midnight.

### Christmas Open House in Kiowa Dec. 9, City Holidays

On behalf of the Kiowa Chamber of Commerce Aimee Bryan apprised the council of upcoming holiday events. Dec. 9 Kiowa plans a Christmas Open House with a long list of activities with a craft and vendor show at the community building in the afternoon. Santa will be in town with businesses open, a free movie for the kids, an evening parade and lots more.

There's a Twelve Days of Christmas promotion. The council agreed to give \$50 Chamber Bucks. Watch the Newsgram for more details of Kiowa's Christmas events. The council agreed to waive all fees for the holiday events at the community building.

The council voted to give city employees off the Monday before Christmas Day on Tuesday. This gives city employees a four-day holiday weekend. The same approval was given for the New Year's holiday the next week.

Holiday \$50 gift cards received council approval for employees to use with Kiowa businesses. The city will also give cash prizes for the Christmas Lighting Contest.

### Callison Honored for Stability

City Utility Clerk Lynette Callison was recognized as the fourth longest tenured staff member of the city. She started as clerk July 21, 2008. Leone recognized her as "a rock star" and commended her for showing "stability" and more.

### Architect Hired and More City of Kiowa Business

The council held more discussion on the city hall remodel project. Leone said they had received two bids for the project but they varied greatly. Leone said that meant there was an issue with the bidding process. To avoid fines and further issues, Leone suggested they get a blueprint.

The council listened to an architect from Cartwright Architecture via telephone. Architect Clint Hibbs from BG Consultants attended the meeting and showed conceptual drawings. The city is contracted with BG for their huge water line replacement project. The council voted to have BG's architect



# Coach Interview: Cherokee Chiefs

Review-Courier: How has the season gone?

Schanbacher: It's gone really well. Coming into the season, our main goal was to make it into the playoffs. We missed out last year and that was the first time in a long time that we haven't been in the playoffs. As the year progressed, we felt like we had an opportunity to maybe win the district and we did have the opportunity to play for that. These guys have just gotten better

and better every week. As we've progressed through the season, our expectations have risen.

How was the overall health of the team this season? Any current injuries?

We've had some injuries. Lake Lyon, freshman, was our quarterback most of the season; he got injured Week 3 against Waynoka. He missed a few weeks, but then came back and was able to play our first two district games. He then re-injured his shoulder and had been out since then. Then we put Kade Chace to quarterback. Against Ringwood we lost two linebackers in the first quarter, and we actually got one of those linebackers back last week. Leone said they've had many snags on getting this project going – one of those being the roof costs ending up way more than first thought. Leone said “the capital improvement fund is lower than we like.”

“We're all frustrated with the lack of speed on this project,” Leone said.







# OU program to help pay Oklahoma's Promise recipients' fees

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) — A new University of Oklahoma program will help cover the school fees of students who receive Oklahoma's Promise tuition scholarships, school officials said.

The new Crimson Commitment program will cover up to \$8,000 worth of a student's fees per year beginning in the fall 2019 semester, The Oklahoman reported. The university plans to invest more than \$1.5 million per year in the program through federal, state and institutional aid sources.

Crimson Commitment will operate in conjunction with the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship, which covers full tuition at public institutions or partial tuition private ones and is administered by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. Students can enroll in Okla-

homa's Promise between eighth and 10th grades if their family's income doesn't exceed \$55,000. About 2,000 University of Oklahoma students receive the scholarship.

Current university students receiving Oklahoma's Promise can enroll in Crimson Commitment if they still meet the tuition scholarship's requirements, which include being enrolled full-time and being on track to graduate in four years.

Incoming freshman who qualify for Oklahoma's Promise must apply to Crimson Commitment by Feb 1. Students must be admitted to the university straight from high school and be first-time, full-time freshman.

The university wants to attract the best students without cost as a barrier,

said Jeff Blahnik, the university's associate provost for enrollment.

"We are taking action to make OU more affordable to Oklahomans and want students in the state to think of OU as their future college home," Blahnik said. "We are dedicated to keeping Oklahoma talent in our state, and Crimson Commitment helps us serve strong students who are in most need of financial assistance."

Crimson Commitment will replace the Sooner Promise program, which covered up to \$5,000 in expenses for students eligible for Oklahoma's Promise, Blahnik said. Current university students with the Sooner Promise program will be automatically enrolled into Crimson Commitment if they meet the renewal requirements.

# New Oklahoma governor adds to transition team, taps leaders

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — Oklahoma's newly elected governor is adding several more business and political leaders to his transition team and to leadership spots on advisory committees on various policy areas.

Republican Gov.-elect Kevin Stitt named nine additional members to his transition team on Wednesday, along with the chairs of seven policy committees. Those policy areas include health, economic growth, education, infrastructure, public safety, government efficiency and Native American affairs.

Retired Oklahoma Supreme Court Justice Steven Taylor of McAlester will oversee public safety, while longtime transportation secretary and the former head of the U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs, Neal McCaleb, will head the Native American Committee.

Others added to Stitt's transition team were retired Air Force Gen. Rita Aragon, Oklahoma 4-H Foundation Director Blayne Arthur and Bank of Edmond President and CEO Jill Castilla.

# Hield helps Kings hold off Westbrook, Thunder 117-113

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — The Kings sprinted out to a big lead and used their up-and-down style to put Oklahoma City on its heels. Then they got a big lift from Buddy Hield's perimeter shooting to finish off the Thunder.

Dave Joerger also got a bit of love from the Golden1 Center crowd after reports surfaced over the weekend that the Sacramento coach was at odds with management over the direction of the team.

Hield made three consecutive 3-pointers late in the fourth quarter and scored 25 points, Marvin Bagley III had his first career double-double and the Kings beat the Thunder 117-113 on Monday night to spoil Russell Westbrook's return.

"We're a hard-playing team and that's what our reputation going around the league is," Joerger said. "In the first half we played maybe as fast as we've played since at Miami (on Oct. 29). We like to play that fast but we got tired. But we kept at it and kept battling."

Iman Shumpert scored 21 of his 23 points in the first half, Bogdan Bogdanovic added 16 points and the Kings

beat the Thunder for the second time this season. Bagley, the second overall pick in the draft, had 15 points and 13 rebounds, while De'Aaron Fox had 13 assists.

Westbrook had 29 points and 13 assists in his first game back in Billy Donovan's lineup since Nov. 5. The seven-time All-Star had missed five games with a left ankle sprain, then left the team Saturday to welcome the birth of twin daughters that same night. He flew to Sacramento and rejoined the Thunder on Monday morning.

"They were coming at us with their pace and we were kind of always backpedaling," Donovan said. "We were never able to generate any force coming back."

The Kings blew a 19-point lead and were up 98-96 when Hield went on a tear from the perimeter. His first 3 extended the lead to 101-96. After Jerami Grant's floater for the Thunder, Hield made back-to-back shots beyond the arc.

Oklahoma City cut the gap to 115-113 on Paul George's fourth 3-pointer with 6.6 seconds remaining. Fox then made a pair of free throws to seal it for Sacramento.

"Right spots, right time," Hield said. "Just trying to pick spots where I could

read the defense and the stuff they were giving up."

George added 27 points and nine rebounds. Steven Adams had 11 points and 15 rebounds for Oklahoma City, which had been an NBA-best 10-1 over its previous 11 games.

"We didn't shoot well," George said. "They sped the game up. We were winning at one point and we didn't finish this game out."

Things got chippy early in the third quarter after Willie Cauley-Stein was fouled hard from behind by Westbrook while going for a layup. As he was going out of bounds Cauley-Stein appeared to shove Westbrook, who stumbled back before going after the Kings' 7-foot center. Adams intervened and grabbed Cauley-Stein, who then shoved Adams while the two were underneath the basket.

Cauley-Stein and Adams were called for offsetting technical fouls.

even more."

Scheck described her building coordinator Adam Maloney as "making a huge difference" at the elementary. She said he drops by the classrooms often and "can call the kids by name."

"I love South Barber. There are good vibes going on down here," she said. "Our staff gets along well and pulls for each other." She described Superintendent Miller as "a complete breath of fresh air." Scheck complimented "our community and parents" for supporting education. "We are so lucky to have the Monty Thompson Education Foundation." She used the \$250 grant they offer every teacher and applied for another grant that bought her a series of novels entitled "Because of Winn Dixie" for her classroom.

### Scheck's Start in Education

Always a "teacher," Scheck was raised in southeast Oklahoma at Stonewall and remembers "playing school" with

her nieces and nephews. She earned her teaching degree in education at East Central University. More recently she earned a master's degree in building leadership from Fort Hays State University. Her intent is to become a principal.

"I love working with kids and teachers to help them improve in the classroom," Scheck said.




